Superiors of the Franciscan Friaries at Adare, Askeaton, and Limerick

Any history of the Franciscan Order in Limerick City and County should include the names of the Superiors at the friaries in Adare, Askeaton and Limerick itself, in so far as it is possible to compile such a list. Recently, when the present writer published a brochure on the Order's history in Limerick City, economic and other reasons

precluded the publication of the list here presented.

It is possible to furnish a lengthy and authentic record of those who were in charge of the above-named friaries at various periods of Irish Franciscan history. The information has been culled mainly from the different chapter records of the Irish Province of the Order. Chapters were held at irregular intervals, and sometimes in places of refuge. When the friars assembled on such occasions new Superiors were appointed to the various friaries, or those already in office had their term renewed. The Franciscan Library at Killiney, Co. Dublin, contains an extensive collection of these records dating back to the year 1629 when, appropriately enough, the chapter was held at the Limerick Friary.

Up to the year 1717 the "Chapter Bills" (as these lists of superiors are called) form part of a collection known as Liber Archivii Provincialis Collegii Lovaniensis. These documents were assembled about the year 1720 at the Irish Franciscan College of St. Anthony, Louvain, Belgium. There they remained until the French Revolution when they were moved to Rome along with other valuable manuscripts. In 1872 political instability in Italy prompted the Order's Superiors to move them all to

Dublin, whence they came to Killiney in 1946.2

The library also contains official copies of nearly all the chapter bills from 1717 to our own time. A few lacunae can be filled from other sources, e.g. the Journals of the House of Lords, the Public Record Office, and a bound typescript made in 1906 by the late Father Edward Bonaventure Fitzmaurice who was once Guardian at Limerick and, for his time, one of the most outstanding Irish Franciscan historians.

Names of Superiors that do not appear on the chapter bills can occasionally be gleaned from other sources. In these instances a footnote indicates the authority for the information. Names are usually latinized and the English equivalent is not always easy to determine. Without altering the essential details of the documents I have tried to modernize these names and eliminate inconsistencies. Now and again, at dates that are close to each other, the same surname appears preceded by a different christian name. It is possible that the same person may be in question in both cases, registered at one point under his baptismal name, at another under his religious name; one cannot be sure without other evidence. It should be borne in mind, however, that the appointment of a particular friar as Superior at any house of the Order does

not always mean that he was able to take up residence there, because of persecution or for some other reason. Consequently, many of these appointments may be regarded

as purely titular, but this practice ceased in 1872.

The year before each name is the year of appointment as given in the chapter bills. Usually when the date comes from some other source, the friar mentioned was actually Superior in the year given though he may have been in office before that.
