Minister comments on Regional

IMERICK Regional Hospital is not to be downgraded says the Minister for Health, Mr. Sean Flanagan, in a letter the Mayor of Limerick, Councillor Jack Bourke.

The Mayor had asked the Minister to clarify the situation regarding the future of the hospital.

The text of the Minister's let-ter—dated September 5th — was released by the Mayor yester

day.
It says:

Limerick Regional Hospital
Dooradoyle.

#### Mystified

"I must say straight away that I was completely mystified as to how a suggestion could have got about that the status of the hospital was to be reduced. As you know, I have indicated agreement in principle with the recommendations which have less published in the report of the Consultative General Hospital Services. ogy, ear, nose and throat der matology (out-patients) and routine isotope facilities in the nuclear medicine field. Special nuclear medicines need. Special ist facilities in obstetrics and gynaecology would, of course continus to be provided in the Regional Maternity Hospital.

Il do not think I need to say more to dispose of the sugges-tion that there was any proposal to lower the status of the hos pital in Dooradoyle.

As regards the motion for consideration at Friday's meeting of the health authority. I wonder if the objection to the Council's recommendations of the leaving of Radional House Council's recommendations on the location of Regional Hos pitals arises from an argument about titles or from something more fundamental.

more fundamental.

'The Council used the description 'Regional Hospital' in reference to the particular functions of the hospital and to its position of association with a medical school. This is clear from the description of the Regional Hospital given in paragraphs 3.23 to 3.29 of the report. (These paragraphs read in conjunction with Chapter to of the report, dealing with specialist services, explain the basis on which the Council arrived at the conclusion that Regional Hospitals, as defined by them, should be estallished at Dublin, Cork and Galway only.)

#### Advanced

I regard the Council's recommendations about the necessity to concentrate specialist sity to concentrate specialist in-patient services, particularly in the case of advanced work as their most significant re commendation.

"They have argued most convincingly that this should be done both in the interests of the patients and as the only effective way of bringing together the variety of specialisms and skills which are increasingly required in the performance of advanced work.

"I do not know what arguments will be advanced in support of the motion, but I would port of the incline, but I would suggest that the health authority would be ill advised to adopt it unless they can eite a body of expert medical opinion in support of it. This, I think they are unlikely to find.

"Indeed, it was remarkable how wide the agreement was about the soundness of the main theme of the Council's report when it was discussed in conjunction with the annual general meeting of the Irish Medical Association.
