RATHKEALE FAIR.

This fair was held yesterday, and was well supplied with the necessary quota in each department ; however there was not a corresponding willingness on the part of buyers to purchase stock, although there was a numerous attendance. Beef rated high and was eagerly looked for. Mr. Timothy Enright, Castle-matrix, Rathkeale, sold two, to Mr. J O'Shaughnessy of Charleville, for £20 each ; he sold 4 to Mr Coghlan, Buttevant, county Cork, for £17 each ; two year olds was in good demand, and brought so high as £13, and Robert K S Sheehy, Esq., sold 13 to Mr Riordan, (Sir David Roche's buyer) for £13 each, and two for £36 ; also two springers for £26 ; Mr Power of Clonsaire, Adare, sold some two-year-olds at good prices ; Mr John Mulqueen, Cartown, sold 20 at £10 10s each to a Dublin buyer ; Mr T Enright sold 10 for £11 each ; yearlings were in brisk demand and all of a good kind were well paid for ; Mr Crotty, Kildimo, sold 10 to a Dublin buyer for £7 each ; Milch cows were scarce—any bought brought fair prices—the highest paid was £13 0s. 0d.

In the sheep department there were several lots of a prime kind on sale. Mr. T. Enright sold 40 to Mr. Mahony, Cork, for £2 2s each. Good lambs brought as high as £1 10s. There was not much demand in general for mutton.

In the horse fair there were some good ones offered for sale. Mr. Joseph Parish, Birmingham, bought a three year old from Mr. Henry Sheehy, Ballygarry, for £50 ; he also bought three animals at £20 each. Inferior kinds were not much looked for.

The pig market on Saturday last was well supplied with prime bacon. There were no buyers in attendance but those from Limerick and business was dull until holders were satisfied that there was a fall in prices at all recent fairs, and they then gave way to a reduction. Mr. T. Enright sold 20 to Mr. Gilligan, Limerick, for £4 5s each ; Mr. Bennett, Graigacurra, sold 10 to Mr. Sheehan, Limerick, at £4 4s each. Several other lots were quickly disposed of.
