Their destructive and aggressive ardour seemed to be altogether damped and they submitted in most cases very tamely to their arrest. Some of them, however, tried to evade their captors by seeking refuge under the seats, but they were speedily dragged out. It was certainly an extraordinary spectacle, and such as has most likely never been witnessed on this line before, to see so large a body as 50 or 60 soldiers taken into custody and marched off in this fashion.
