This valuable collection is comprised of articles of Glass, Lace, Work in Metals, Ivory, Carriages, Pottery, Woven Fabrics, Jewellery, Enamels, Japanese and Lacquered Works, Porcelain, Photographs, Drawings, from the great Exhibition of 1851, Engravings, Russian Antiquities, together with several of the costliest and most beautiful pieces of old Sevres Porcelain belonging to the Queen's unrivalled collection, and which Her Majesty was graciously pleased to lend to the Department of Science and Art for the purpose of forming part of the circulating museum.
