ed the exhibition will be a sell-out.
"It's a very healthy market out there. They're literally sucking up everything. I've been showing work there showing work there since 1990 and Irish work has always sold very well in Hong Kong through the ex-pat community," said Mr Quillinan, who is on the board of the Bourn Vincent Gallery at the University of Limerick.

weeks, each of the nine artists intends to use the city as an impetus for future collections, which they will then display in Limerick and again in China at a later date
