## Artistic Response by Gerry O'Mahony

LIMERICK ARTIST Gerry O'Mahony has just mounted his first solo exhibition "Response" at the Belltable Arts Centre.

The formal opening this week was performed by script writer and actor Patrick Dawson, a friend of Gerry's.

Mr. Dawson said that Limerick should be proud of Gerry, whose works were of impressive quality. Religious symbolism was evident throughout the exhibition, which was to some extent inspired by the Bahá'í Peace Statement and the desire for a better and more peaceful world.

"I am very impressed by what I see", Mr. Dawson commented.

He also paid tribute to the Belltable Arts Centre, which is renowned nationally and internationally for its contribution to the visual and dramatic arts. "You should cherish it", he went on. "Don't let it go".

Patricia Rainsford Murphy, writing in the catalogue commented: "It is an exhibition of paintings that attempt to express, with honesty, an individual vision for the world. It is an invitation to observers to both share that vision and create their own. It is a statement and a challenge".

Gerry O'Mahony graduated from the Limerick School of Art and Design in 1975 and has worked in various capacities as art teacher and graphic designer. He currently works and lives in Limerick and is a member of the All + 10 Sorts Collective.

He has travelled extensively during his time, spending long periods in both Africa and Israel. Inspiration from the colour and landscapes of both these places, along with the landscape of Ireland can be seen in the work featured in "Response".

The exhibition runs until the end of September.
