Top artist to exhibit in Dolmen

Mr Collins has gained quite a reputation in the art world, with his paintings fetching record prices in Dublin, and gracing the collections of such notable public figures as Dick Spring.

A native of Limerick, after training Mr Collins moved to Barcelona, where he was based for 17 years. Now aged 42, he returned to his native city just two years ago.

His family have a pub, Tom Collins' on Cecil Street, and Mr Collins can often be found working in the bar. His paintings also grace the walls. However it is in the galleries of Dublin that he has made the biggest impact.
