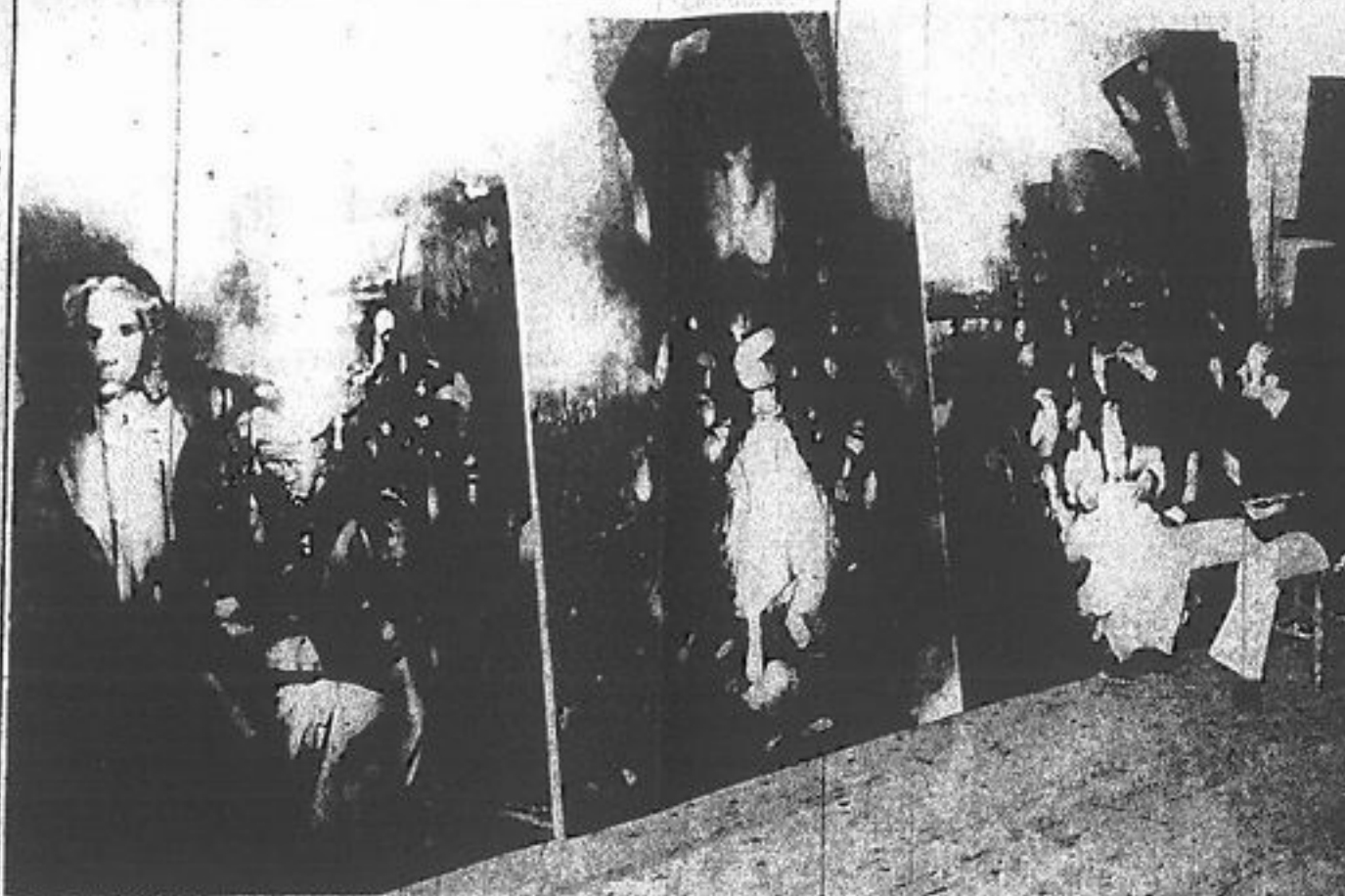

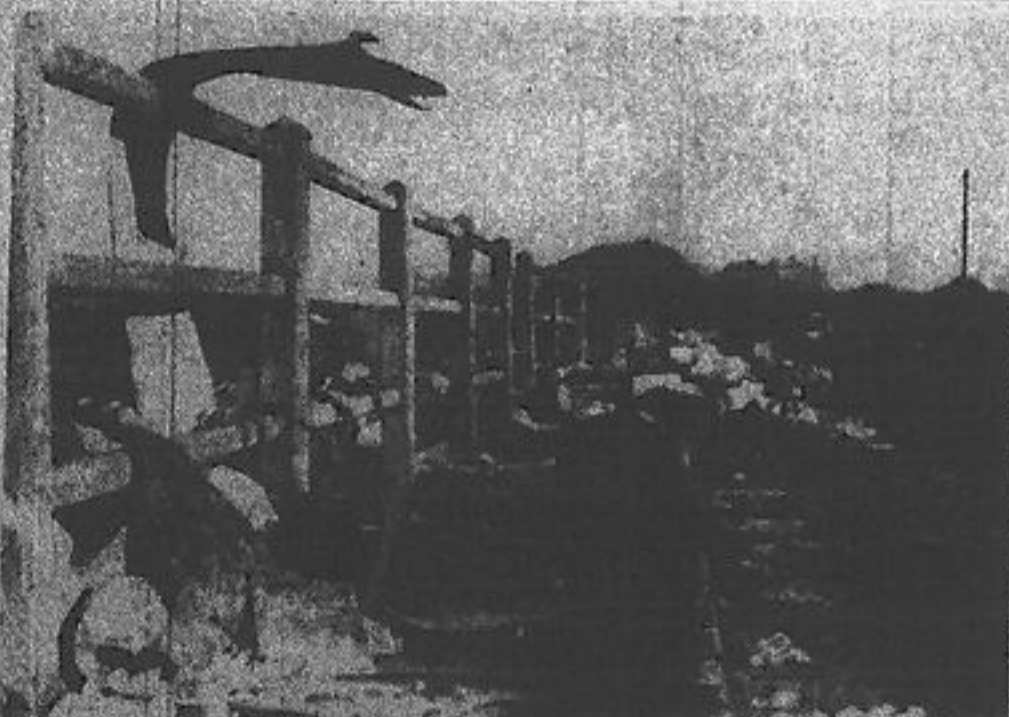
Heroic Limerick... captured on canvas

And the third depicts the signing of the civil and military articles by Lord Lucas on October 3rd, 1691.
