LIMERICK C.B.S. Pipe Band is now the biggest pipe band in the world. And many experts also regard it as among the best. At Limerick's recent interna-tional Parade the C.B.S. beat 47 contingents to win the coveted Shannonside Trophy for the best overall band.

The band was founded in 1963 by Brothers Kenny and Wright on the ideals of fellowship, discipline and musical talent. Loyalty to these ideals has, according to the members of the band, been the key to their success in the 19 years since.

The tough groundwork of teaching the new members piping and drumining skills is undertaken by the senior members of the band each September, with Pipe Major Laurence Duggan and his assistant, Des Boland, teaching the pipes, while Jim Nestor, Michael McDonagh and David Frawley teach the drummers.

associated with Limerick, it has in fact travelled widely, since the first trip abroad to Holland in 1975. Then 45 members visited the Netherlands and played a number of engagements over a two-week period, culminating in the civic reception accorded to them by the Irish Ambissador in the Hague. In 1978, the band toured Scotland and performed at the World Pipe Band Championships. In 1980, the boys found themselves in France where they visited Paris, Brive, Politics, and Brittany. However, the highlight of that trip was their visit to Lourdes.

Here the band joined/forces with the Galway Diocesan Pilgrimage led by Bishop Casey, and had the unique privilege of playing at the International Mass in the underground Basilica, as well as at the torchlight procession.

The band is self-supporting, financing itself through engagements, two annual flag days, and a membership fee of £5 paid by each boy.
