## Boherbuoy Youth Band changing their name

**THIS WEEK CAME THE** announcement that the Boherbuoy Youth Band have changed their name to the Limerick City Brass and Reed Youth Band. Said the founder member, Mr. Paddy Benson. "The decision to change our name came after long and careful deliberation. Many people thought we catered exclusively for those in the Boherbuoy area when, in fact, we have children in our band from all parts of the city.

"We have many requests from parents to change our name so that we could be identified with all sections of the city and we thought it only fair to give their sugges-

tion consideration. Hence our new title." The Limerick City Brass and Reed Band have made tremendous progress since they were formed in 1974. Invitat-

ions are pouring in to them daily to participate in concerts, recitals etc. and seldom is a request turned down. "There are occasions when we have to think of the wel-

fare of the children under our care and if we are offered an engagement at some unearthy hour we naturally enough have to decline it."

It is encouraging to know that in this day and age of vandalism that we have children in our midst who are prepared to devote their leisure time towards furthering their musical talents.

And a pat on the back, too, to those dedicated officers and committee members of the band. Their work for the youth deserved recognition.

Continued dental mechanic Paddy Benson:

"It is our ambition to build our own hall and we hope to realise that dream this year. Plans for a new building are already with the architects."

The Limerick City Brass and Reed Youth Band have instruments to the value of £7,000... all of which are paid for.

At present they are catering for 112 boys and girls, with upwards of 300 more on the waiting list.

New uniforms are on order. They cater for those in the age group 9-14, and lessons are given each evening at the ITGWU Hall, in O'Connell Street.

Concluded Paddy: "When our new premises are ready we hope to double our present membership."

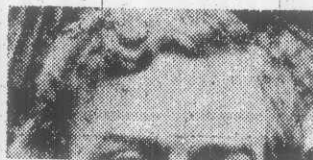
