DOGS ORDER, 1966

The Minister for Agricult-ure and Fisheries has made an Order, entitled as above, under the Diseases of Anim-als Act, 1966, requiring that or person in charge, unless the dog is wearing a collar or harness with the name and address of the owner inscribed thereon or on a platfor badge attached thereon or on a platfor badge attached thereon or on a platfor the property of any dog while being used for the hunting of same (excluding rabbits) of the property of any greyhound either at a greyhound track or authorised coursing meeting, or on any pack of hounds or in respect of any dog while being used for police purposes by a member of the Gardas Siochana.

The Order also requires that every owner or person in charge of a dog shall during all of the hours between sunset and sunrise prevent the dog from straying by:

(a) confining the dog in a building, shed, yard or other enclosure from which it cannot escape,

(a) effectively securing the dog by collar and chain, or collar and secompanying the dog and keeping it under effectual controt.

The Order will come into force on January 1, 1967, and will apply in respect of dogs in urban as well as rural areas
