STATISTICS OF FAILURES, &c.

The number of Failures recorded in Ireland, during the week ending Jan. 28th, was 9, viz:—New Bankruptcy Proceedings published in the *Dublin Gazette*, 4; Deeds of Arrangement filed at the Bills of Sale Office, 5. The respective numbers in the corresponding week of 1892, were Bankruptcies, 4; Deeds of Arrangement, 7. Total, 11; being a net increase in Bankruptcies of 1, and a net increase in Deeds of Arrangement, in 1893, to date, of 5.

The number of Bills of Sale published in Ireland for the same week was 8. The number in the corresponding week of last year was 11, showing an increase of 8, being a net increase in 1893, to date, of 4.

The number of Bonds and Judgments published for the same week was 69, of which 18 were against Traders, and 51 against Farmers and non-Traders. The number in the corresponding week of last year were 12 against Traders, and 2 against Farmers and non-Traders, showing an increase of 6 against Traders, and a decrease of 9 against Farmers and non-Traders, being a net increase in 1893, to date, of 16—*Kemp's Mercantile Gazette.*
