THE COST

The building of the City Hall will be in two phases. The ordinary functional departments will take approximately two years to build at a cost estimated in the region of £1,000,000. The second phase, which will consist of an auditorium and other amenities. torium and other emenities, will take a further two years at a cost of a further £1,000,000. Half of the cost will be met from local funds and the balance will be borrowed on a 20 years loan. The overall cost to the ratepayer will be 30p in the £ for the first phase spread over a period,


