The Cinema Fights For Li

British Film Year, which got under way this month, was officially launched last October. During the launch, David Puttnam had some defiant words for the attendant media: "We're working damn hard to make it work," he said. "If you choose to be cynical about it, if you choose to ignore it, if you choose not to support it, we are in a lot of trouble."

It got under way in London with the Royal Film

Committees of volunteers have been set up in 25 cities and towns and their role will be to stimulate interest in the cinema through events, premieres, star visits, and a travelling road show which will tour England during the summer months.

• The declining status of the cinema manager is one of the most frequently cited reasons for British cinema's long decline. The aim is to make the managers feel that they are "responsible for their own product", thus encouraging greater diversity and individuality within the cinema itself.

Rank and Thorn EMI have each pledged £1 million a month to a cinema refurbishment programme.
