The Carlton

● Quietly, and without any fanfare, the management of the Carlton in Shannon Street, Limerick, celebrated the 45th birthday of the cinema this week.

● The opening attraction way back in 1940 was the Charles Boyer and Irene Dunne co-starrer, "When Tomorrow Comes," which attracted capacity attendances.

● The Carlton screened continuous performances, from 2 p.m. daily, and still remains the only house in Limerick to have such an early opening. Such was the demand for cinema entertainment in those early days of World War II.

● The proprietors were Mr. E. L. Wickham, an auctioneer, and Richard Williams, the fairground showman who was fondly remembered as "Davy Donnelly's right hand man." Donnelly was known as "The King of Showmen" in those days.

● It had many managers down through the years, all of whom made their own special contribution to the Shannon Street cinema. Among them I have fond memories of Douglas Ashleigh (certainly the most knowledgeable), Bracey Daniels, Wilberforce Raphael, Eddie Gleeson, Maxie Maguire, a chap named Jimmy Wilson (his brief career is a story in itself) and, of course, the present holder of the position, the ever courteous Mrs. Kirby.

● For the past 45 years I have composed the display advertisements for this house, and in 1943 devised one for the James Stewart-Marlene Dietrich film, "Destry Rides Again," which earned the plaudits of the Hollywood film company of Universal Pictures.

● The Carlton is to-day the flagship of the Ward-Anderson chain of cinemas in Limerick.

● May I add my congratulations to the many which have poured into the house in the past few days.
