"The Exorcist" is the story of a pretty 12-years-old girl turned into a scabrous, swollen-faced monster growling and screaming blasphemies at those around her.

The critics have said that "it is not for the timid, the faint-hearted, or the squeamish."

Certainly, Jack Bourke has pulled off a major coup by securing this highly controversial film for an opening attraction.

In the second cinema, "Scarecrow" is another of these "wanderer" films with Gene Hackman and Al Pacino.

They are cast as a couple of hikers who team up on the road to Pittsburg and find plenty along the way to keep them from their goal—including gaol.
