Mrs. Mary Collins

● One of the best known business ladies in this area, Mrs. Mary Collins, died this week. She was actively associated with the cinema trade in Limerick since the late 1940s when she took over the ailing Athenaeum Cinema in Cecil Street and opened it as the Royal with a staggering parade of the hit movies from 20th Century Fox, Paramount Pictures and Warner Brothers, to name but a few.

● She was also the only cinema owner in Limerick to install stereophonic sound which was heard to startling effect in a series of attractions (especially "Rose Marie"), and a number of short musical films.

● She took a very deep interest in the cinema, and as part of the Breen Circuit of Waterford, became nationally known for the quality of her screen attractions. The Royal also had stage shows, concerts, and talent searches, especially during the run of the film, "Deep In My Heart."

● For the past two decades or so she was part of the Ward-Anderson chain.

● Her health began to fail towards the end of last year and it was with deep regret that I learned of her passing on Tuesday of this week.

● Her late husband was one of the best known members of the legal profession, and he practised from an office in Glentworth Street. He passed on many years ago.
