DEFENCE Minister, Mr. Michael Noonan, T.D., today announced "two significant developments" involving the total grant expenditure of £33,000 to Limerick Civic Trust.

At a function at Limerick Chamber of Commerce, Minister Noonan revealed that the Teamwork contract with the Civic Trust is to be renewed for a further term.

"This will enable the Civic Trust to recruit 10 unemployed youths and a supervisor to carry out outdoor works as part of their 1989 programme of environmental improvement projects in the city," said Mr. Noonan.

He also announced that the joint FAS-Shannon Develop-

ment Community Enterprise Committee has authorised the payment of a full time enterprise worker within the Trust for the next 12 months.

"The enterprise worker will have as his brief a development role to assist Limerick Corporation and Shannon Development in the implementation of the major Heritage Precinct project, which I believe will establish Limerick City as a national tourism destination," he added.

The enterprise workers will focus on attracting a wide

variety of related employment creating enterprise like coffee shops, guest houses and shopping, to locate within the precinct when it is complete in 1991.
