



# Curraghchase is tops with tourists

THE GENTLE landscape and serene countryside at Curraghchase, which inspired the literary works of the de Vere family for 300 years, now provides enjoyment for approximately 4 000 caravaners and campers, as well as thousands of day callers, each year. Situated in deep 600 acres of

woodland, Ireland's newest and most exciting caravan park was officially opened in

June, 1983, by the Taoiseach,
Dr. Garret FitzGerald.
The park is beautifully laid out
within 13 acres of the State forest
and is capable of accommodating 60 touring caravans, with facilities for up to 40 tents.

Every site on the park has been planned to give as much privacy as possible by sensitive tree-planting and landscaping.

Other facilities on the site include a campers' kitchen, laun-dry room, television and games room, children's playing facilities, toilets and showers, and a site shop fully stocked with groceries, souvenirs and tourist maps and information.

Visitors to the site last year included French, Germans, Ita-lians, Australians and New Zealanders.

The manager of the site, Mr. Clive Killick, who previously worked as an engineer, said that people came to Curraghchase to enjoy a quiet and relaxing holiday in peaceful surroundings. "At Curraghchase, we en-

deavour to provide the necessary facilities in a friendly atmosphere", said Clive.

Ably assisted by his wife, Gill, Clive, as well as looking after all the facilities on the site, is available at all times to advise tourists on other attractions in the

Commenting on the location of the site, which is registered with the Irish Caravan Council, Clive said it was ideally located in the heart of the countryside and within driving distance of such attractions as Bunratty Castle and Folk Park, the Burren, Lough Gur Stone Age Centre, the Cliffs of Moher visitor centre and many other places of scenic interest. scenic interest.

Many visitors to Curraghchase who come with the intention of staying just one night are so pleased with the facilities that they remain on the site for up to four

While some of the visitors move out to visit other attractions, some just remain on the site and anjoy fishing in the lake, or strolling through the many nature walks carefully looked after by the Department of Forestry.

The forest nature trail takes a route around the wildlife lake and


route around the wildlife lake and through many interesting locations where geological and vegetation features can be seen.
