DEATH OF MR. JOHN DONNELLAN.

We regret to record the death of an old and highly esteemed citizen, Mr. John Donnellan, Mount Kennett House, who passed away on Sunday last in the 83rd year of his age. The deceased gentleman was well known throughout Limerick and adjoining counties, having been for some fifty years cash-keeper in the Land Agency Office of Messrs. R. Hunt & Son, from which he retired some time ago. Since then he has been in delicate health. Mr. Donnellan, it may be added, was one of the oldest Commissioners of Oaths in the South of Ireland. He was a most courteous and kindly gentleman, and though he had reached a patriarchal age his demise is deeply regretted by a wide circle of friends. Mr. Donnellan's sons occupy leading positions in the medical and other professions, two of them having important practices in London. The funeral will take place from Mount-Kennett House to-morrow at eleven o'clock.
