THE SUICIDE OF AN OFFICER.

An inquest was held yesterday on the body of Captain John Finlayson, veterinary surgeon 13th Hussars, who committed suicide on Monday at his residence, Rathdown terrace, North Circular road. It was stated that he had been in depressed spirits, and that he appeared to think Colonel Clayton was his enemy. Colonel Clayton deposed that there was no foundation for such a supposition. While walking with Captain Finlayson on Thursday evening, he gathered from his conversation that he was very much upset at his having been called on to resign. He had no grievance against anyone, and his sole concern appeared to be money matters. The jury returned a verdict of suicide during temporary insanity.
