An Italian engineer, Signor Regnol, claims to have invented a new propeller which will increase the speed of the fastest steamers by seven or eight knots.

Department wherein any one of the businesses mentioned in Clause four of this Order is usually carried on, and the height of said partition shall be eight feet, measuring from the floor, and the said partition shall make it absolutely impossible for any business included in this Order to be carried on.

The occupier of any such shop in which any of the said terms or conditions is not observed contravenes the provisions of this Order.

8. No person shall after the Closing Order carry on any retail trade of business in a place not being a shop within the area to which this Order applies. A person who carries on any retail trade or business in any such place after the closing hour contravenes the provisions of this Order.

9. **PENALTY.** A person who contravenes the provisions of this Order shall be liable to a conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction Act to a fine not exceeding in the case of a first offence of one pound, in the case of a second offence five pounds, and in the case of a third subsequent offence twenty pounds.

10. **EXEMPTION.** Where the occupier of a shop is charged with an offence against this Order he shall be entitled upon information duly made by him to have any other person whom he charges as the actual offender brought before the Court at the time appointed for hearing the charge, and if after the commission of the offence has been proved the occupier of the shop proves to the satisfaction of the Court that he used due diligence to enforce the execution of this Order, and that the said other person has committed the offence in question without his knowledge, consent or connivance, the said other person shall be summarily convicted of the offence, and the occupier of the shop shall be exempt from any fine.

11. **AUTHORISED SALES AFTER HOURS.** Nothing in this Order shall render any person liable to any penalty in respect of any sale made after the closing hour when a Special Order requiring immediate execution reaches a shop at such a time as to make it impossible to have such order executed before the closing hour, provided that the assistant assistants engaged in executing such order shall get a half holiday on a subsequent day in lieu of the Thursday Half Holiday.

12. **FAIRS AND BAZAARS.** Nothing in this Order shall apply to any Fair lawfully held or a Bazaar for a charitable purpose.

13. **EXCEPTED DAYS.** This Order shall not apply to the following Thursdays:
(a) The Thursday preceding Good Friday.
(b) The Thursday preceding Xmas Day.

14. **EVIDENCE.** A printed copy of this Order certified by the Clerk of the Council shall be prima facie evidence thereof.
