INSURRECTION ACT.

A RETURN of the Names of all Persons committed to the Gaol of the County of Limerick, under the Insurrection Act, from the 1st of January 1825 to the 1st of February 1824; specifying The nature of the Offence, and the dates of the Commitments, severally; also, The dates of the Trials of such Persons, the Names of such as have been convicted, and at such as have been acquitted, as well as of those upon whom Sentence was severally recorded, and the Periods during which all Persons committed had suffered Confinement.

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24 June 1824.
