# Farewell to a beautiful, beautiful Munsters fan

RICHARD Harris's may never have received the Freedom of Limerick from our city councillors - but last Saturday the "ordinary" people of the city and county turned up in their droves to pay their last respects to the great actor.

While the media circus outside the O'Connell Street church concentrated on interviewing dignitaries such as former Taoiseach Albert Reynolds, and actors such as Aaron Harris and Darragh O'Malley, what would have pleased Richard Harris most would have been the turn out from the ordinary people of Limerick with almost 700 filling the church.

All the rugby clubs were represented, particularly Young Munster, Garryowen and Old Crescent.

As one wag said: "I have never seen the Jesuit's so full. Would'nt they love a crowd like this every Sunday."

Lord and Lady Dunraven, rugby player Mick Galwey and members of the Harris family from all over Ireland and England attended the Mass said by family friend Fr Tommy Byrne, a Redemptorist.

Elegant Elizabeth Harris, the first wife and mother of Richard Harris' three children attended with her son Jared.

Brothers Ivan, who

lives in Limerick; Noel in Dublin and Billy in Southampton, and the rest of the Harris family received the sympathy of the huge congregation who shook their hands at the end of the Mass.

His granddaughter, Ella Harris, who was the apple of Richard's eye and who persuaded him to take the part of Dumbledore in the Harry Potter films, certainly looked as if she could follow in the Harris footsteps.

She gave a superb rendition of the poem, I write as told, penned by Harris back in 1942,

Bearded son Jared who bears much of the intensity and looks of his father, read a poem his father wrote after the death of Richard Burton—changing Burton to Harris for the occasion.

Members of the

Harris family helped with bringing gifts to the altar. Ryan Harris, brought a Young Munster jersey; James Sullivan, wearing a Garryowen jersey, brought a rugby ball, while Timothy Fine, representing Crescent College Comprehensive, brought the Munster Schools Junior Cup.

The choir members of Crescent College Comprehensive were superb throughout as was the input of musical director Helen Moloney, with instrumentalists Bernice Molony, Barry Holmes, Eibhlin Ní Chathasigh and Fiodhna Burke, and organist John O'Farrell.

While film producer Noel Pearson was officially giving the eulogy, Fr Byrne, who referred to the actor as

"Dickie" also gave enlightening excerpts from their youth together; their days in Kilkee and the daring acts of Harris who would cycle his bicycle on walls and was unbeatable at playing racquets on the beach.

His three loves after his family were: children, Limerick, and particularly Limerick rugby, and his profession of acting.

Gerry Griffin, the well-known Limerick undertaker supervised matters in the church and was one of the guests of the family later brought to Jurys Hotel where Young Munsters Willie Allen and Ald Pat Kennedy's wife, Loretto, started a singsong with Beautiful, Beautiful Munsters—a fitting way to end the day of tribute to Harris.
