Richard Harris and Carole Lesley, two of Associated British Studios' most popular young stars, arrived in Dublin to-day to make a personal appearance at the premiere of "Ocean Eleven," which is being presented at the Adelphi Theatre to aid the funds of The Actors' Church Union.

Richard Harris, the young Limerick-born actor, has just completed the most important role of his career, co-starred with Richard Todd and Laurence Harvey in the Michael Balcon production for Associated British, "The Long and the Short and the Tall."

In this screen adaptation of the London stage success which was selected by the "London Evening Standard" as the play of the year, Harris portrays the role of Corporal Johnstone. Advance reports from the studio indicate that the young star is outstanding and that the film establishes him among the forefront of top screen artistes. Harris, it will be remembered, has also appeared in "Alive

and Kicking," "A Terrible Beauty," "Shake Hands With The Devil" and "The Wreck of the Mary Deare."

Carole Lesley can lay claim to the title of the Blonde Bombshell of British films. She recently chalked up a success in "Doctor In Love" and previously starred in "Operation Bullshine." Her services are in constant demand and only last evening she made her debut as a T.V. star in the play "Tiger At The Gates."

Both Richard Harris and Miss Lesley arrived at Dublin Airport at 2.35 p.m. and during the day were guests at a reception which is being hosted by members of the Actors Church Union Charity Committee.

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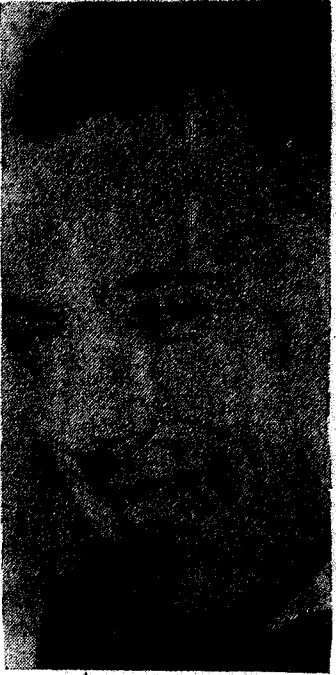
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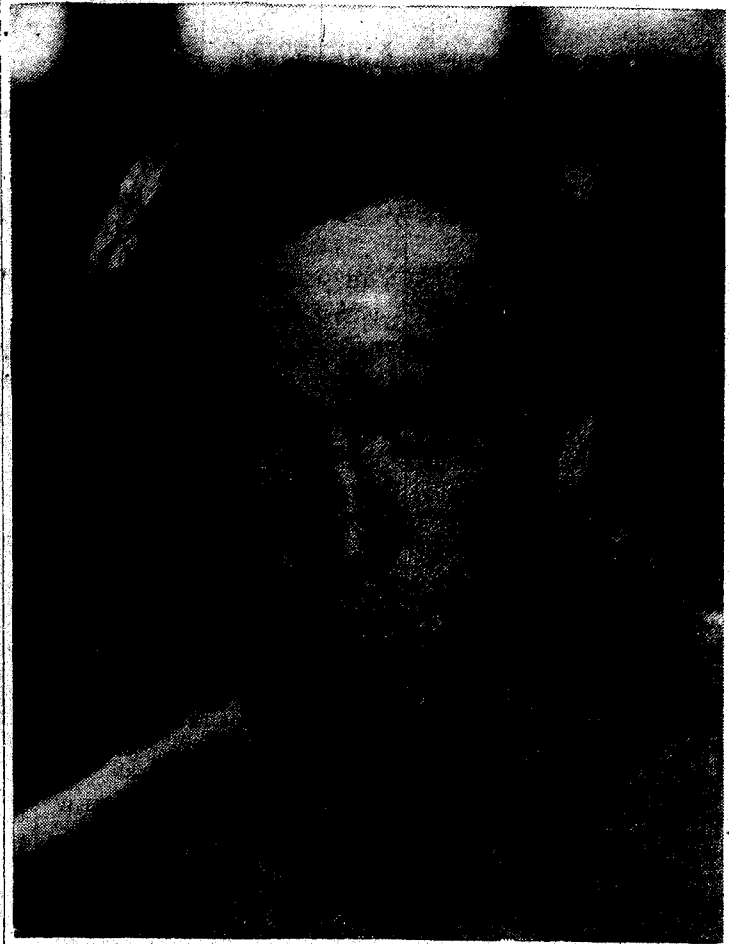
