Billy Fury failed to appear at the "Monday Night Out" Show at the Parkway, Limerick, last night, and disappointed hundreds of his fans who turned out to see the show.

Fury's Irish tour was handled by a Dublin agency called Star Attractions Ltd., from whom the Limerick promoters booked Fury's act. A telephone call on Monday evening at 7 p.m., just one hour before the show was due to start, advised the Limerick promoters that Fury and his backing group had hastily returned to London earlier that day and would not be fulfilling his Limerick contract.
