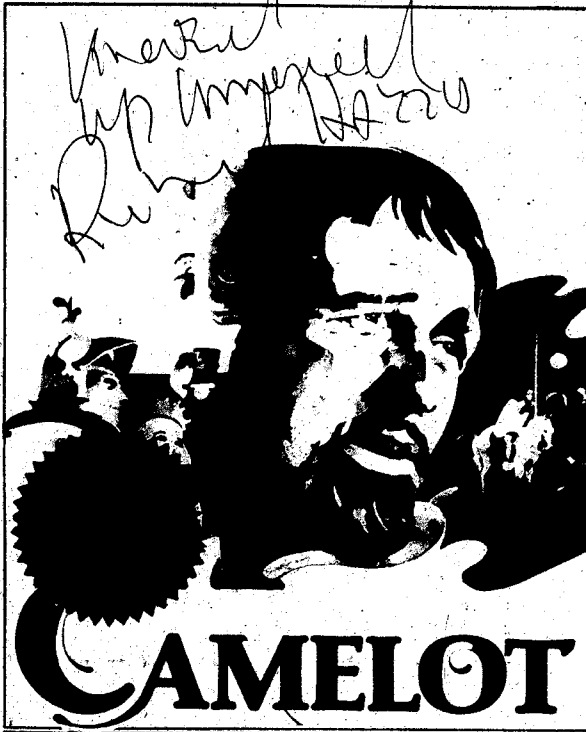

## Richard Harris In New York

● Limerick actor Richard Harris is currently the biggest attraction on Broadway in the lavishly mounted stage production of "Camelot," which opened in New York's Winter Garden Theatre on Tuesday, November 10.

● Local authority on Broadway musicals—Vincent Prendergast—was in the theatre to see the memorable opening night performance which brought the cheering and applauding celebrity-laden audience to their feet several times. Harris received a twelve-minute ovation at the end—almost unprecedented in New York history.

● It was a glittering first night with stage, screen and political luminaries, as well as the cream of New York, paying homage to the Limerick actor who has certainly come a long way in the past twenty years.

● Richard Harris has had a distinguished career in films, on stage, and in television, but his triumphant transfer to Broadway must be the highpoint in two decades of solid performances in all three media.

● "Camelot" was received with rave notices by the foremost critics of the American press, and the show is certain to enjoy a long run.

● As Vincent was leaving, Harris, backstage in the early hours of Wednesday morning, the one and only "Dickie" cried after him, "Up Garryowen."

● Certainly, Limerick has reason to be proud of such a fine performer in his hour of triumph on the Great White Way.
