The training of an air hostess takes eight weeks and the course includes flight procedures and documentation, route information, first aid, catering, grooming and deportment. Since January, 40 new air hostesses have passed through the Aer Lingus training school.

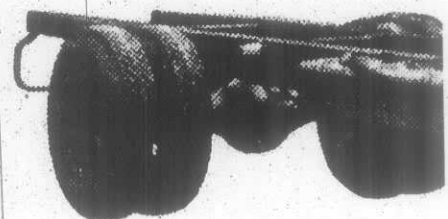
