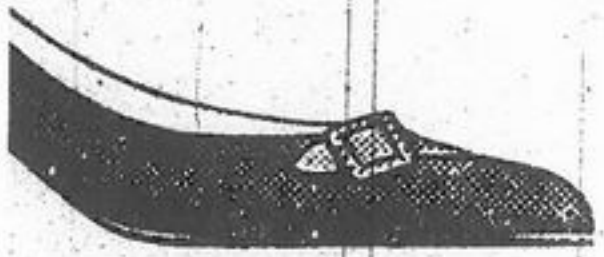

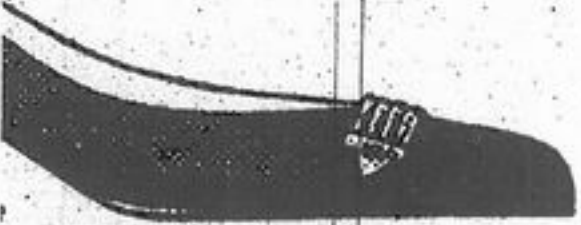

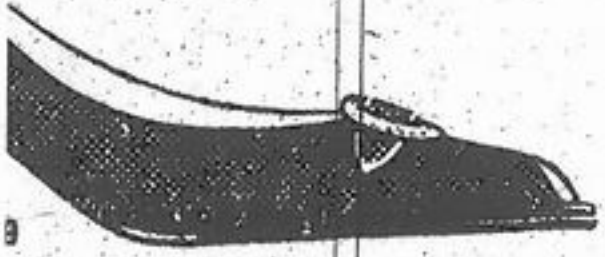

Funeral Of The Late Canon Hayes

A manifestation of sorrow un-
paralleled in the history of Bansa

when thousands of sympathisers

their final tribute to a lovable
pastor, the late Very Rev. J. M.
Canon Hayes, P.P., Bansa,

Among the thousands who at-
