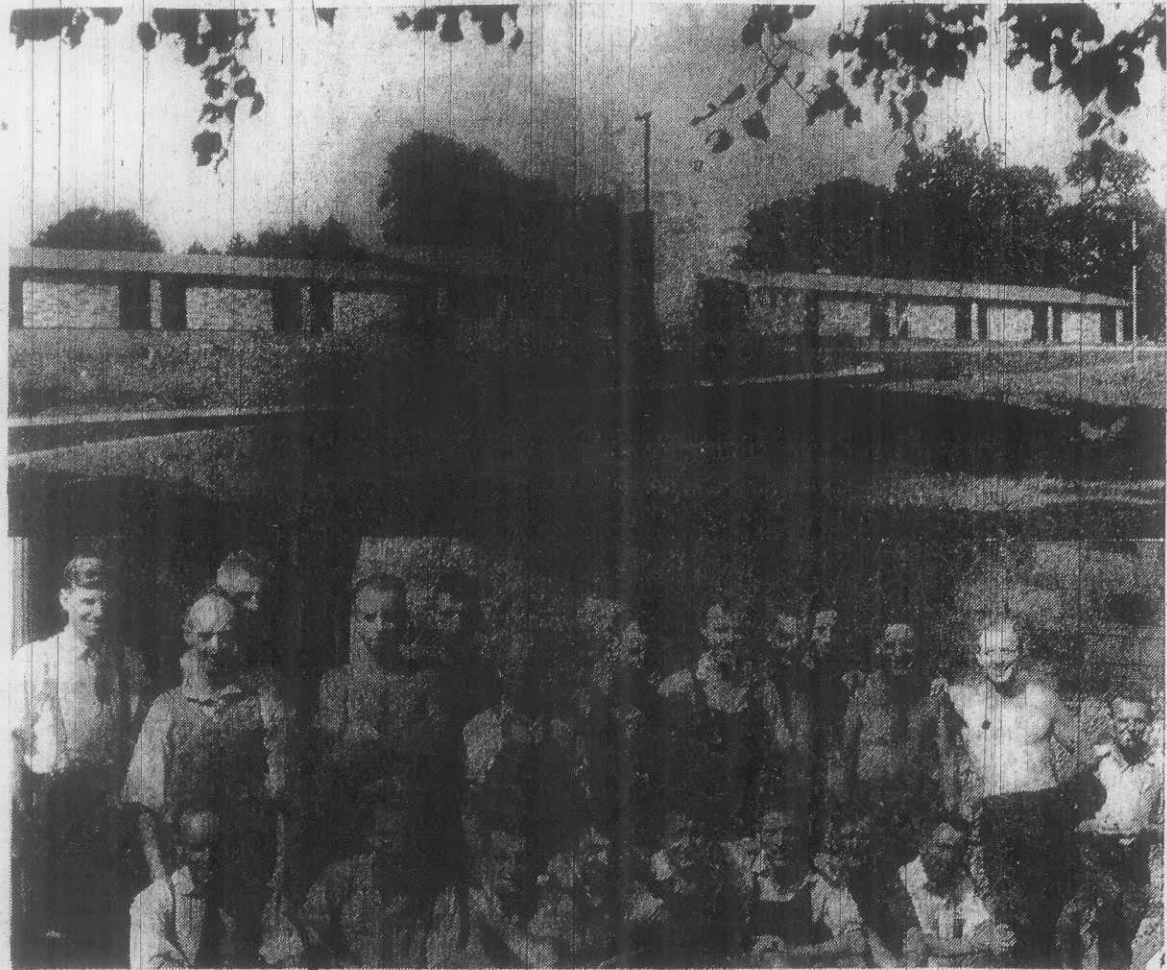

Appointments To Be Made At "Tech" Meeting

Several appointments will be made at the meeting to be held to-night in the "Tech," of the City of Limerick Vocational Education Committee.

Three permanent whole-time teachers will be appointed. They are (1) a male teacher of commerce; (2) a male teacher of Irish and continuation subjects, and (3) a female teacher of Irish and commerce.

A female clerk-typist will be also appointed, in addition to the appointment of a part-time attendant-cleaner.

Sixty Masses Said On Top Of Croagh Patrick

Sixty priests offered up Mass in the Oratory on the top of Croagh Patrick yesterday from 4 a.m. until noon. An estimated 50,000 people from Ireland and abroad climbed the Reek during the week-end on the national pilgrimage.

Thousands made the climb fasting and remained in prayer on the mountain until they received Holy Communion at the early Masses. A sermon in Irish was preached on the summit by the Rev. Patrick Costello, M.A., B.D., St. Colman's College, Clonmorris, and one in English was preached by the Rev. Martin Newell, B.D.

In a sermon in St. Mary's Church, Westport, yesterday, Most Rev. Dr. Walsh, Archbishop of Tuam, appealed for prayers for Catholics behind the Iron Curtain and also for prayers for the success of the Ecumenical Council to be held in Rome.

Ten special trains and 75 buses, as well as private transport, brought the pilgrims to Westport. A shuttle service of buses brought the pilgrims from Westport Station to the foot of the mountain. Members of the Order of Malta Ambulance Corps dealt with 149 minor accidents.

Week-End Big Robberies In London

A number of big robberies were carried out in London over the week-end. More than £10,000 in cash was taken from a safe in the strong room of a bank in Stepney, East London.

The raiders made tea while undergoing the task of boring through the ceiling doors. This morning police took away cups to examine for finger prints.

Raiders who broke into another bank in Ilford succeeded in opening a safe in the strong room but found no cash inside. They failed to open a second strong room where there were several thousands of pounds.

Over £3,000 in cash, as well as dollars and cheques, were stolen from the American Express Company's office in London.
