We announce, with regret, the death of Sir John Arnott, Bart., at his residence, Woodland, yesterday morning. For many days Sir John's condition was not very hopeful, and there has passed away an eminent commercial man, and a native of Ireland, whose name will be long re- ceived with the undoubt- edly to it. Sir John's career was one of energy and perseverance, and he was in the morning of his life to do so much for an important cause in Limerick at one time, and in the working classes. In 1881 he raised in Dublin and Limerick a fine and valuable figure. Sir John pro- claimed he would prove a success at a lower rate than he demonstrated by the success of his bakery in Bedford Row, part of the South, and to be sold down to the usual price.
