THE ALL-IRELAND JUNIOR HURLING CHAMPIONS



The Limerick All-Ireland Junior Hurling Championship team and officials were in happy and optimistic mood when they left Limerick for London on Friday of last week. At the end of the trip was greater jubilation, as the Limerick team succeeded in winning the All-Ireland junior hurling title—a feat that has not been accomplished by a Shannonsiders' selection since 1941. The occasion was memorable in every way. The team and officials were feted in London by the recently-formed Limerick Men's Association there, and on their return to Limerick their homecoming on Tuesday night was reminiscent of the county's halcyon days in All-Ireland finals.
