

COLONEL JOINS LIMERICK TALK-IN

FDUCATIONAL training has always been part a soldier's training, but last September the Army Authorities originated a scheme in co-operation with the Vocational Education Committee whereby N.C.O.'s and men of suitable basic education could attend a full time day course at the local Vocational Education School.

A commercial course, covering Irish, English, commercial arithmetic, maths, history, goog-raphy, book-keeping, commerce economics, typewriting and sociology was planned in such a manner as to enable the soldier student to obtain the Group Certificate in one year.

In the Southern Command classes were formed in Limerick, Clonmel and Cork.

The Limerick class, at the Municipal School of Commerce, which consists of three corporals and 11 privates, was visited today by Colonel D. Fitzgerald, director of training, Army Headquarters, who was courses.

They were officially opened by Mr. Terence McMahon, chairman, and blessed by Fr. Gallagher

Fr. Gallagher said that the flats would not have been built were it not for the generosity of St. John's C.Y.M.S., who gave a loan of £6,000 and an anonymous donor who presented a gift of £2,500.

Tributes

Fr. Gallagher said that each flat was rented at f3-5-0 per week, plus 10 - compulsory savings - at 6 per cent which would be refunded

He paid a tribute to the building contractor, Mr. Harry Ryan, Newport, Co. Tipperary, and to the Limerick Corporation for providing a site, and to Sis-Caoimin, Limerick Social Service Centre.

Mr. T. F. McDermott. City Manager, said that the Corpora-tion were unable to give first preference to newlyweds in providing houses, as those people who were living in bad housing conditions had to be cared for first

It was a real blessing for the Corporation when the Catholic Housing Aid Society came forward and offered to build these flats for newlyweds,

He assured the society of every assistance in the future. The City Manager apologised for the unavoidable absence of the Mayor, Ald, Steve Coughlan,

"The religious minority groups in Limerick enjoy exactly the same freedom as the rest of the citizens, and are in no way discriminated against, and indeed, this is only as it should be,

"Limerick is the only area in the country outside of the capital, to show a 10 per cent increase in population in recent years, "Both the Buchanan and Lich-

field regional studies have designated it as a regional growth centre. It is an outward-looking, progressive city, proud of its glorious historic past, and ready and willing to meet the challenge of the future.
