LIMERICK.—APRIL 12.

The Hon. the East India Company's packet, Georgina, Captain Leigh, which sailed from St. Helena, the 9th of February last, arrived at Tarbert on Wednesday last.—The packet was chased for 7 hours by a large-French privateer, in lat. 51. 15. long. 18° w.—The dispatches brought by the Georgina, were on Thursday morning forwarded from hence to London, by the Dublin Mail Coach.—Passengers arrived from St. Helena are, Lieutenants Dredge and the Hon. — Jones, brother to Lord Ranelagh, and Mr. Dredge, Purser, all of the Sceptre man of war, lately lost in India, and Mr. Oaks, late Chief of the Mussalipatam Settlement.

On account of the change of Troops in this City, General Sir James Duff, Bart. dissolved the late Court-Martial—and on Thursday last the following Court assembled in the County Grand Jury Room, and were sworn in, viz.

The Court directly proceeded to the trials of Pat. Boland and Mat. Ryan, charged for having with others committed a Burglary and Robbery on the night of the 25th of January, 1799, in the house of Mr. John Blackburne, near Galbally, in this County, and torturing the said Mr. Blackburne and his wife by strangling them.

Yesterday the Court-Martial proceeded on the trial of James Flannery, charged with treasonable practices, in assembling with several others in arms at Little-Ormond-Still, Co. Tipperary, last September, for the purpose of attacking His Majesty's Corps of Yeomanry quartered at Castle-Orway, and seizing the arms and ammunition belonging to His Majesty deposited there, and for procuring Pikes and Bayonets to be used in case of Insurrection or Rebellion; also with conspiring to murder Cooke Orway, Esq; and Sir John Carden, Bart. Magistrates for the County Tipperary.—The Court were this day engaged on the above trial.

Stokes and Sheehan, convicted on the clearest testimony before a General Court-Martial last week, for the horrid murders of the Messrs. Bland, are to be hanged on Fedomore-hill, on Monday next;—Slattery, tried for the same offence, is to receive 1000 lashes at Bruff same day, and to be transported for life;—Moriarty, who gave testimony in favour of Slattery, having grossly perjured, is to receive 500 lashes at Fedomore on Monday.

The 16th Regiment, as mentioned in our last, arrived here on Thursday and Friday evenings.
