

Friday last, His Majesty's Cutter *Hawke*, Lieut. Buckle, and the Camden Revenue Cutter, Capt. Murphy, failed from this harbour, with the following vessels under convoy, for London, viz. *Enterprise*, of Limerick, Barry, navy provisions; *Industry*, of Greenock, Galbraith, do.; *Friendship*, of London, Pringle, ditto; *United Brothers*, of Biddford, Carder, ditto; James and George, of ditto, Laffier, ditto.

Monday last, John and William Collins were executed at Croom, pursuant to sentence:—their bodies were first evening brought back and deposited in Croppies-hole, at the rére of the New Gaol.

While the crowd of spectators were assembled to view the bodies of the above Malefactors, one of the Sentinels of the Military Guard fired, and wounded in a most desperate manner a Boy in the arm, and a Woman in the thigh:—The Soldier was lodged in the Main-Guard.

James Kennedy, on Monday, received 120 lashes at Croom, in part of his punishment, mentioned in our last.

On Monday the following Men were brought in from Cappa-White, pursuant to the order of General Sir James Duff, Barr. viz. Thos. Dwyer, John Leahy, Patrick Kearns, Edmond Cuffello, Connor Meeher, Richard Dwyer, Wm. Murnane, and John Meagher.—They had before been sentenced to be transported, but by some means came back to their respective homes—they will be sent to New Geneva in a few days.

When the Guard were bringing the above Prisoners to this City on Sunday last, we are informed, they were attacked by a great number of Country People, near the Chapel of Doon, when the Military fired and killed two Men and two Women, on which the rest dispersed in all directions.

The General Court Martial have not sat since Saturday evening.

Yesterday, part of the Suffolk Fencible Regiment marched into this City from Tralee, &c. being relieved by the Clare Militia.

This day, 17 men and a woman were brought in and lodged in our County Gaol: they are charged with breaking into the dwelling house of a Woman, an inhabitant of Kiltelty, last week, and cutting her in a barbarous manner.
