

with the *Nymph*, of 35; to which was added on appearing off Plymouth, *Admiral Berkeley*, in the *Mars*, of 74 guns, with the *Atlas*, of 93, and *Ajax*, of 80, making 10 three-deckers, two ships of 80 guns, one of 73, and 13 of 74, to which will speedily be added other ships from Plymouth, and several that have been refitted at Portsmouth.

The commercial intercourse between Holland and France and the country is increasing daily; our imports consist of large supplies of potatoes, pork, bacon, beef, wheat, oats, leather, hides, madder, gin, currants, wine, linen, &c. and our exports embrace most articles of our colonial produce, and certain prohibited goods exported by certificate. Considerable quantities of sugar, coffee, calicoes, &c. were yesterday entered at the Custom-house for Antwerp, Calais, Dieppe, Ostend, Amsterdam, and Rotterdam; and there are now in the river several vessels for each of these ports.

One hundred and seven tons of potatoes were, during the last week, received from Holland.

The 5th Dragoons on Wednesday embarked at Portsmouth, for the Mediterranean.

HOUSE OF COMMONS.

Monday, June 5.

The House refused to commit on the propositions respecting countervailing duties voted in the present session, transmitted to the Parliament of Great Britain for its agreement in the same, and returned back with that Parliament's concurrence therein without any alteration.

Right Hon. Mr. BERESFORD proposed that the question should be put on the whole, as the duties had already been agreed in, and as he recollected that the article of cordage was the only one whereon any difference of opinion had taken place.

On this a short conversation followed between Mr. Speaker, Lord Castlereagh, Sir John Parnell, and the Chancellor of the Exchequer. It was contended on the side of Opposition that the specification made would be tantamount to a bounty in favour of England, should the people of England, more generally than at present, grow hemp. On the other side it was replied, that of late years a premium was allowed for growing hemp in Ireland, and that the same encouragement is provided in future to exist—but should the growth of hemp be hereafter more prevalent in Great Britain, (a case impossible) as to injure the hemp in this country, that it would then behave the wiser Legislature to provide again any disadvantage in that particular to Ireland.

After some other observations on each side, the article was concurred in without any amendment, as also the several other items, respecting countervailing duties, and the Chairman having left the Chair, and the House being resumed, the report was received, read, and concurred in.

A message came down from the Lords, acquainting that House, that their Lordships had reconsidered in the matters contained in the papers about countervailing duties, as previously voted by both Houses, and latterly concurred in by the British Parliament, and requiring the further concurrence of the Commons in a Resolution of Address to His Majesty, expressive of such their again agreement.

On an order made, a committee was appointed to consider the Resolution of the Lords, which having proceeded to Mr. Speaker's chamber forthwith, after a short while returned, on whose report the House adopted the said Resolution.

Lord CASTLEREAGH read to the House, in obedience to his Excellency's command, a message from His Majesty, notifying his gracious approbation of the late address of congratulation.

The Message was ordered to be entered upon the journals, and an Address of thanks, in answer, was moved by his Lordship, and voted by the House.

Last Thursday, a considerable quantity of American Flour was sold by public auction, in the corn-market of Cork, to housekeepers, by the single barrel. An immense quantity, we understand, is immediately expected to arrive at that port from America, which will, no doubt, reduce the price of this article in the markets of this city.

Cork, June 5. This day the greater part of the 5th and 63d regiments marched into town from Cove, where they debarked from on board the *Rosbeak*, *Regulus*, and *Ceres*. The *Dread*, with the remainder of those Regiments had not arrived this morning, but was hourly expected.

We understand the 20th Regiment are to embark at Cove, to-morrow, or Saturday, on the secret expedition.

The sloop *Two Friends*, of this port, has been captured off Beachy-head, by a French cutter privateer. The crew taken out, except one man, who, with four Frenchmen remained on board until the next morning, at which time the Frenchmen abandoning her, she was brought in to Portsmouth on the 30th ult. by the foremast man of the crew who was permitted to remain on board.
