day or two affer, he affigned to him. He did believe that there were many then in the Houfe that would gredit that the zeal and anxiety he at all times shewed for forwarding Inland Navigation could not have proceeded from fuch a pecuniary confideration. His objects were, to fecure to the city of Dublis provisions if they were in the kingdom, and to encrease agriculture, on which the prosperity of every country depended. In his opinion the Union would not have been complext without encouragement given to Inland Navigation, and he was certain that Island Nevigation could not facceed without the Union .-As lath these great objects were now nearly accomplished, he had no difficulty in declaring to the House, that he was under the fullest conviction of mind that with the farther aid of the high character and brilliant talents of the Noble Lotd, (which no Member of the House can doubt) that we shall be a peaceful, prosperous, rich and hasse country.

The new clause and the bill were then ordered to be engroffed, and after having disposed of feeral other orders of the day, the House

The House of Commons on Tuesday evening was wholly occupied by the Committee on the loss bill, in which Mr. L. White was heard by Counsel against the clause pronouncing his depofire forfeiture; but as nothing materially differing from what was urged on a former day took place, we forbear entering into a detail which would be but repetition.—The Chancellor of the Exchequer moved a faving clause to sable M. White to relief in equity against the enactment of the bill, and the House being refamed, the report was ordered to be received yefterday.

Wednesday, the House of Commons resolved into committee on the bill for continuing certain ads to prevent tumultuous rifings, agreed to the provisions with several amendments submitted by Mr. Prime Serjeant .- Mr. O'Hara proposed to limit the amount of tolls on the River Shannon, and the Cuts communicating therewith, when the fame shall be made navigable, The clause was rejected, and the bill read a third time and passed -Adjourced to Thursday.

It is supposed that an adjournment of the Hente of Commons will take place about Friday or Saturday next, until the Bills shall have returned from England, when the follion and the local Legislature of Ireland will be determined by the Royal Affent given to the Act of Union, and a speech delivered from the Throne.

The blockade of Genoa appears to have been ultimately the rain of the Austrian affairs in Ita-Ty, for if General Ott's forces had been united to those of General Melas, though Massena and his garrifon had been at liberty to march out of Genoz, the battle of Marengo would very probably have turned to the diladvantage of the French, which, without fach affilance, was fo long doubtful. Thus affairs in fraly would have taken a gaite different turn from what they have done,
