"The proofs you have given on this occasion of your uniform attachment to the real welfare of your country, infeparably connected with the Security and prosperity of the Empire at large, not only entirle you to the full approbation of your Sovereign, and to the applaufe of your fellow-fubjects, but must afford you the furest claim to the gratitude of pofferity.

" You will regret with his Majesty the reverse which his Majerly's Allies have experienced on the Continent - but his Majefty is perfuaded that the firmness and public spirit of his subjects will enable him to perferere in that line of conduct which will best provide for the honour and the effential interests of his dominions, whose means and refources have now, by your wildom, been more elofely and intimately combined.

" Gentlemen of the Houfe of Common, " I am to thank you, in his Majesty's name, For the liberal fupplies which you have chearfully granted for the various and important branches of the public fervice in the prefent year.

" His Majesty has also wienessed with pleasure that wife liberality which will enable him to make a just and equal retribution to those bodies and individuals, whose privileges and interests are affected by the Union, and he has also icen with fatisfaction that attention to the internal profperity of this country, which has been to confpicuously testified by the encouragement you have given to the improvement and extension of its Inland Nivigation.

" My Lords and Gentlemen,

"I have the happinels to acquaint you that the country in general has in a great measure returned to its former flate of tranquillity. If in some districts a spirit of plunder and disaffection fift exitts, those disorders, I believe, will prove to be merely local, and will, I doubt not, be foon effectually terminated.

" The pressure of fearcity on the poorer clasfes, though much relieved by private generofity, and by the falutary provisions of the Legislature, has been long and unufually fevere; but, I cruft, that under the favour of Providence we may draw a pleasing prospect of future pleasy from the prefent appearance of the harvest.

" I am perfueded that the great meafure which is now accomplished could never have been effected but by a decided conviction on your part that it would tend to reffere and to preferve the tranquility of this country, to increase its commerce and manufactures, to perpetuare its connexion with Great Britain, and augment the refources of the Empire. You will not fail to imprefs the fentiments on the minds of your fellow-fubjed -- vou will encourage and improve that just confidence which they have manifelled in the refult of your deliberations on this ardent quellion. Above all, you will be studious to inculcate the full canviction, ther, united with the people of Great Britain into one kingdom, governed by the fame Sivereign, protected by the fame laws, and represented in the same Legislature, nothing will be wanting on their part but a spirit of indullry and order, to infure to them the fpirit of industry and order, to infure to them the full advantages under which the people of Great Britain have enjoyed a greater degree of profperity, fearity, fand freedom, than has ever yet
