Waterford, Aug. 14. Monday put into Passage, the Three Friends, of Emden, bound from Amsterdam to Bourdeaux, with bale goods, prize to a Lottery privateer of Jersey.

In the City Court on Tuesday, Catherine Why, Eleanor Power, Catherine Kennedy, Elizabeth Balger, Catherine Phelan, Tho. Kennedy, & James Foley, were tried for stealing potatoes in John Walsh, farmer, of which charge they were found guilty, except James Foley and Elizabeth; the others were recommended to mercy the Jury, from a consideration of the length of time they were confined before trial; they were burnt in the hand, and discharged.—Jane was arraigned for a felony, but there was no prosecution.—Thomas Henley, sen. T. Henyon, and Catherine Ryan, were charged on having safe-coin in their custody, without openly accounting how they got it.—Thomas Why, sen. found guilty, sentenced to pay a fine of 10l. to be imprisoned 12 months, and after that he gives bail for good behaviour, 50l. and two forfeitures in 25l. each.

Sentence of Court was, that he pay a fine of 50l. on the suggestion of Counsellor M'Duane, as to the inability of the prisoner to pay in a sum, the Judge was pleased to remit it.—Thomas Henley, jun. and Catherine were acquitted, but detained to give bail, 50l. each, and four others in 25l.

In the County Court: Denis Cronceen, Michael Cahill, charged with treasonable practices, were discharged; as were Pat. Diolen & Thomas Hennessy, for uttering forged notes of the Bank of Ireland.—James Aylward, for stealing, was acquitted; there was an inability in the indictment, and he is detained in prison on another.
