Resolved, That the present Market at the head of William-street, be the place for the purchase of Wheat; Bank-Place and the Market-house, for Oats and Barley, until more suitable places be found;—and all the Quays for what Grain may come by Water.

Resolved, That we will (when necessary) co-operate with the Mayor, in carrying the above Resolutions into effect, and that they commence on Monday the 13th inst.
