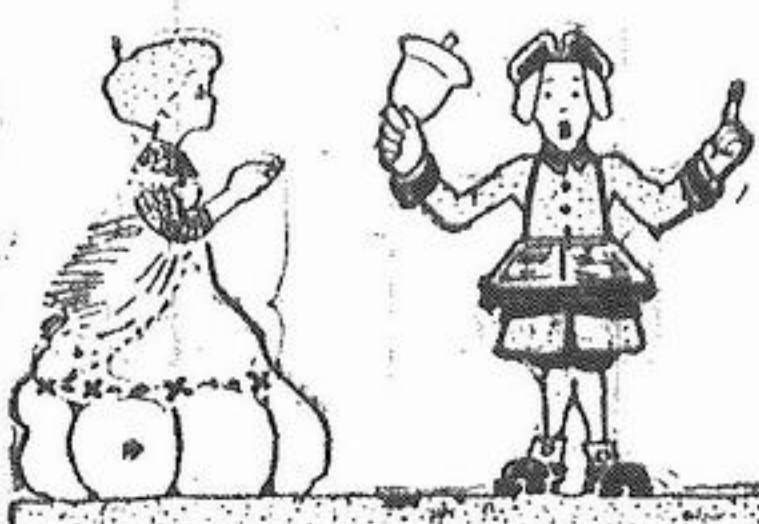

The Peace Conference resumed a deliberation on the future of the Near East at Downing-street today.

MINERS AND WAGES.

A National Delegate Conference of the Miners' Federation was held in private at Westminster today, the chief business being the proposed new wages scale.

Mr. Bridgman, in the Parliamentary paper, says the announcement that the Coal Owners' Association had agreed on a programme to lock out the miners to force a wages reduction is untrue.

The Conference adjourned till this afternoon. South Wales urged measures for inducing the whole Labour movement taking drastic action within fourteen days to enforce the proposals for work or maintenance, but there was divided opinion on the wisdom of a direct action policy.

DRILLING PARTY SURPRISED AND CAPTURED.

An official message received in Dublin states—On Sunday thirty-eight members of the Irish Republican Army, found drilling at Partry, Co. Mayo, were surrounded by Crown forces converging from three points, and all were captured without casualties.

PRUSSIAN DIET ELECTIONS.

Berlin, Monday.—The official results in the Prussian Diet elections are—Majority Socialists—99 seats. Centre—70 seats. Democrats—21 seats. German National Party—66 seats. People's Party—51 seats.

INDUSTRIAL DEPRESSION IN BELGIUM.

Brussels, Tuesday.—Some Belgian coal mines have suspended work in consequence of an industrial crisis.

WIFE OF FORMER GERMAN AMBASSADOR.

Washington, Monday.—A suit has been filed on behalf of the Countess von Bernstorff, wife of a former German Ambassador to the United States, to recover, approximately, one million dollars worth of property seized during the war. It is declared the property was inherited from the Countess's father, an American citizen.

BRITAIN AND FRANCO-POLISH AGREEMENT.

Paris, Tuesday.—The British Embassy declared there is no truth in the report that Britain opposes some clauses of the Franco-Polish agreement.

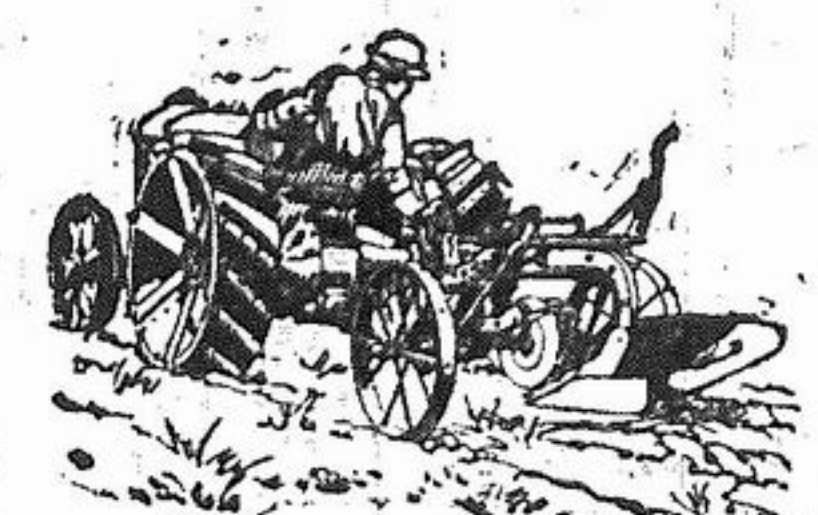
