**RAILWAY EXTENSION.**

The High Sheriff of Tipperary presided at a meeting of the landed proprietors, landholders and estate agents of the Barony of Upper and Lower Ossington, on Thursday, to consider the propriety of constructing a line of railway from that town to Roscrea, when it was resolved to carry that desirable object into effect by giving the usual guarantee.

**Wednesday, June 8.**  
**ODD FELLOWS SOCIETY.**

On Monday evening the first anniversary soiree of the "Banks of the Shannon" Lodge of the Order of Odd Fellows took place in the Northumberland Rooms, which were well attended. Mr. Pettie was called to the chair, and briefly returned thanks.

**Saturday, June 11.**  
**WM SMITH O'BRIEN.**

Wm Smith O'Brien, Esq., arrived here on Thursday evening at the house of his father-in-law, Joseph Gabbett, Esq., having landed same day at Queenstown, in the "Vigo" from his trip to America. He reached his seat at Chalmers yesterday.

George O'Brien, Esq., of Broughfield, Co. Clare, has been appointed Justice of that county.

## SALMON FISHERIES

Under an Order made by the Food Controller, the use of any net, except a landing net, for the capture of salmon or trout in the fresh water portion of any river, is prohibited between the hours of 9.25 in the evening and 7.25 in the morning—instead of between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. The alteration is consequent on the Summer Time Act, and the Order will remain in force during the period of the year 1921 in which that Act is operative.

**BRISBAWAIR FISH EXPORT.**

Under an Order recently made by the Food Controller, English fish-merchants are permitted to receive from Irish consignments of fresh-water fish during the period of the English close season of 1921 (1st March to 15th June). The Order does not affect salmon, sea trout, chad, etc., etc., as a condition of the Order stipulates that a certificate of origin must accompany all consignments of fresh-water fish. Supplies of these certificates may be obtained on application to the Fisheries Branch, Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction, 3 Kildare Place, Dublin. The Order is in no way in violation of the Fisheries (Ireland) Acts or any by-laws made thereunder, nor does it authorize any person to trespass on a private fishery for the purpose of taking fish.

## THE ASTRONOMERS' CLEARING HOUSE.

The Royal Belgian Observatory, which has circulated the news of the discovery by a South African astronomer of a new comet, has taken over the duties of the astronomers' "clearing house," which before was conducted by the German Observatory at Kiel. During the past year the Danish Royal Observatory, at Copenhagen, made itself responsible for this important work, which involves the collection and subsequent distribution to the observatories of all countries of observations of comets, and the astronomical discoveries. This international astronomical clearing house is headquartered at the Kiel Observatory. When, in 1866, Prussia annexed Schleswig-Holstein, the Kiel Observatory ceased to be a Prussian observatory, and was transferred to the German Government. Prussia transferred the Kiel as a German naval observatory, and Kiel became the international clearing house until Denmark took it over again during the war.

## MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS.

M. Kohn, Counsellor of the Czech-Slovak Legation in Berlin, has been appointed Minister to Spain.

Lord and Lady Parmoor have arrived in Vienna to make a personal investigation into the social conditions in the city.

So firm a hold is being taken upon Birmingham that many of the public works are now bound of these clods.

Income tax, which is being collected this year in South Wales, is only 40 per cent of the amount collected last year.

Mr. Rintzema Saarl will attend the Imperial Conference which is to be held in London in June, as the representative of India.

The Attorney-General (Sir Gordon Hewart) said he could not state when the trial of the German war criminals would take place.

It is announced that ex-Queen Amalie of Portugal has just purchased the Chateau de Bellevue at Chenev, a suburb of Paris.

The Red Star Line steamer Lapland left Antwerp en route for New York, carrying 920 emigrants, almost all Poles.

Lady Biddisley has taken the oath as magistrate at Stoke Newington, and Mrs. Counsellor Benwell as a magistrate of North Hackney.

Three men in an aeroplane carrying films of the Grand National from Liverpool to London made a forced landing in a market garden at Romford.

A party of 60 farmers, with their wives and children, who left Liverpool on Saturday for "Canada" took with them £45,000 to invest in Canadian land.

It is said that "Clavering Children," which was sold at Christie's for 5,000 guineas last week, was bought by Mr. J. P. Clarke on behalf of Mr. John M. Corman, the Irish tenor.

An arch is being erected at a cost of £7,000 by the Great Central Railway Company at Sheffield Victoria Station in memory of railway employees who fell in the war.

The first prize of £4,000 in the Grand National was won by a British girl, Hilda Roberts, the daughter of a British linen merchant.

M. Meyer Braun, Norwegian Minister of Commerce, states that the Russo-British trade agreement will remove the obstacles to an eventual Russo-Norwegian agreement.

The Bombay-Poona detective force has succeeded in arresting 25 persons, mostly Pathans, who are alleged to have been connected with the recent series of dacoities.

General Haking, the High Commissioner of the League of Nations at Danzig, was received in Warsaw by President Pilsudski, and also conferred with Prince Sapieha, the Polish Foreign Minister.

Sir Herbert Asquith, who is attached to the Financial Secretariat of the League of Nations, has resigned his seat in the Canadian House of Commons. His resignation leaves five Parliamentary seats without representation.

President Millerand has directed that the railway saloon in which the Armistice of 1918 was signed is to be preserved as an historical relic at the Invalides in Paris.

Mr. Israel Cohen is on his way back to Palestine from India. He has raised altogether £15,000 in Australia and the East for the Palestine Restoration Fund.

The Ministry of Pensions and Shipping (Cassell Hill) was held a second time last week. The measure has already passed the House of Lords.

Mr. Chamberlain informed Viscount Carson that the Government would still hold and maintain its controlling interest in the Anglo-Persian Oil Co., after the present issue of new capital was completed.

Mr. Bridgman stated that the number of persons and companies who were the owners of coal mines and collieries at present was 1,373. He did not know the aggregate number of shareholders in engaged in coal mining.

Sir P. Lloyd-Greene said there was nothing in the trade agreement with Russia which prevented a British offer of bringing an action in the courts to enforce the rights of British subjects where English courts had jurisdiction.

Captain Logan, the son of the Peruvian President, has temporarily abandoned his attempt to fly from Callao to New York. He reached Santa Elena (Ecuador), 778 miles from Callao. He intends to try again with a more powerful sea-plane.

President Harding, replying to a personal appeal from Dr. Ferrar, President of Panama, has decided to send the daughter of Chief Justice White to the Panama-Costa Rica boundary dispute "must be the unalterable position of the United States."

Over 4,000,000 Japanese teachers and school children have contributed towards the £12,000 and 60,000 sets of clothes presented by the Japanese Educational Association to the Chinese Government for the benefit of children of the in-misstricken provinces.

The Brazilian Government on March 17 promulgated the Anglo-Brazilian Treaty providing for the establishment of a Permanent International Commission to investigate and report on all matters in dispute between the two parties other than those which will be settled under arrangements already made.

Mr. James Hope, replying to Lt.-Col. W. Guinness, said the House had sanctioned an expenditure of £1,676 on salaries and fees of the staff engaged since 1910 on the preparation of a history of the Ministry of Munitions. The sum of £3,000, estimated cost of paper and printing, would be met out of the Stationery Vote.
