## LIMERICK COUNTY COUNCIL

Scheme for Scholarships  
From Primary to Secondary  
Schools in County Limerick.

I.—NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS.  
Six of the annual value of £40. The Committee  
shall be at liberty to reduce the value of the  
Scholarship where the pupil's parents or guardians  
are in a position to bear part of the expense of  
his or her education. The Committee shall,  
likewise, have power to make a supplementary  
grant not exceeding £10 per annum towards the  
maintenance of any scholar whose parents are  
unable to meet the expense incidental to residence  
in a Secondary School.

II.—CONDITIONS OF TENURE.  
(A) The Primary School from which the pupil  
comes must have adopted the Gaelic League Edu-  
cation Programme as modelled by the Gaelic  
League, viz., (a) Irish to be the official School Language,  
i.e. Irish to be used for Roll Call, orders, prayers,  
&c. (b) Irish to be taught for vernacular use to  
each child for at least one hour per day. (c) Irish  
History to be taught to all pupils.

(B) The Secondary School which the pupil, or  
his parents or guardians, chooses to hold the holding of  
a Scholarship shall be adopted (a) the Gaelic  
League Programme for Secondary Schools, viz.,  
Irish to be taught to all pupils for vernacular use,  
(b) Irish history to be taught to all pupils. (c) All  
Examination Papers to be set in both English and  
Irish, each pupil examined to have permission to  
answer in whichever of the two languages he may  
think fit. (d) That foreign language to be permitted  
in setting and answering questions. The pupil to  
be taught at the Secondary School with a view to  
Matriculation at the N.U.I.

III.—TENURE OF SCHOLARSHIPS.  
The tenure of these Scholarships shall be for four  
years provided the pupil shows satisfactory pro-  
gress as tested by the periodical school  
examination. (b) the annual school examination at  
the end of the academic year, (c) the special test in  
Irish and Irish History applied by the Committee's  
Examiner at the end of each year, (d) a satis-  
factory report from the Examining Committee of the  
Secondary School in the summer of each year at the expense  
of the Committee, until certified as able to be  
taught through the medium of Irish. The courses  
for the Special History Examinations are:—(a) At  
the end of First Year—Story of Ireland, Bilingual.  
Bilingual. (b) At the end of Second Year—History of  
Ireland and Story of the Irish Race (Bilingual).  
At the end of Third Year—Last  
Conquest and Sean A'leim, "The Irish  
Wars, by J. J. O'Connell, M.A., and Sean  
A'leim, by Sean O'Connell, D.D.

IV.—RESIDENTIAL QUALIFICATIONS.  
Scholarships shall be restricted to pupils who  
are of Irish birth and whose parents or guardians  
have been resident in the County for five years.

V.—OTHER QUALIFICATIONS.  
Children of labourers or farmers whose valua-  
tion does not exceed £20 shall be awarded a  
full Scholarship. Children of farmers whose  
valuation exceeds £20 but does not exceed £80  
may, at the discretion of the Committee, receive  
a reduced Scholarship, the value of which shall  
be determined by the Committee with a view to  
the parents' circumstances. Children of others  
than farmers or labourers may be awarded a  
Scholarship (full or reduced) if the Committee  
shall decide, according to the circumstances of  
the parents.

VI.—AGE LIMIT.  
Pupils shall be eligible for Scholarships up to  
but not exceeding 16 years on the first of June.

VII.—REFERENCE.  
Every candidate for a Scholarship shall, before  
being admitted for examination, produce a satis-  
factory reference from the Teacher or School  
Manager of his School, together with a medical  
certificate as to fitness, and a recommendation  
from a Clergyman of his parish as to character.

VIII.—AWARDS.  
Scholarships shall be awarded strictly in order  
of merit, &c.

IX.—EXAMINATION.  
Candidates for Scholarships shall be subjected  
to a competitive examination—oral and written—  
to be held by Examiners appointed by the Com-  
mittee.

X.—GENERAL POWERS.  
The Committee reserve to themselves the right  
to exclude any candidate from competing for a  
Scholarship without assigning a reason. The  
Committee also reserve the right to revise this  
Scheme or any part of it at any time, subject to  
the sanction of the Limerick County Council.

SYLLABUS.  
The following is the list of subjects for examina-  
tion (written and oral) as may be necessary:—  
IRISH, IRISH HISTORY, LATIN, FRENCH,  
ARITHMETIC, ALGEBRA, GEOGRAPHY, BOTANY,  
DOMESTIC SCIENCE, RURAL SCIENCE, GEOMETRY,  
and ENGLISH. Irish and Irish History are  
essential; any other three subjects from the fore-  
going list. 100 marks will be assigned to each  
subject. No award will be made to any candidate  
who has not passed in each of the five subjects  
(30%) and secured at least 250 marks out of the  
aggregate 500.

GEOMETRY—Euclid—Books I and II.  
BOTANY—(a) Terms—Root, Stem, Leaf,  
Stipules, Bracts, Flower, Calyx, Corolla, Stamens,  
Pistil, Fruit, Seed, Receptacle and Nectary. (b)  
To recognise fifty plants; to know their names in  
Irish and English; (c) To be able to give a brief  
account of the locality and uses of twenty plants;  
(d) Four names, twelve specimens from  
each with Irish and local names.

RURAL SCIENCE—(1) Examination of a simple  
plant and its parts; (2) Flowers—their structure  
and uses; (3) Fruits—disposal of seeds and uses of  
fruits; (4) Winter twigs and buds; (5) Seed and  
germination; (6) Work of roots and leaves in  
growing plant; (7) Plant propagation; (8) Climate and weather-  
weather charts; (9) Construction and uses of  
barometer and thermometer—hygrometer and

PRECE- WRITING.—The pages set for both Stages will be similar to the pages of character, but different in respect of difficulty. 1. Candidates will be furnished with printed material, and will be required to draw up a Prece- 1, a brief and clear statement in the form of a narrative of the essential facts, while omitting those that are unessential. 3. Clear and neat handwriting, and clearness and consciousness of expression, are essential to success. 4. The material will carry for one year to year; it may consist of a series of letters, the report of a meeting, a narrative passage, or other similar matter. 5. The length of the Prece should not exceed 300 words.

COMMERCIAL CORRESPONDENCE AND BUSINESS KNOWLEDGE.—Questions may be set on the subject of the matter of the Stage II Syllabus, but a higher standard of knowledge is expected from Stage II than from Stage I. Candidates for the question will cover the following additional matters:—1. The mechanism of general foreign trade, both import and export, in all its aspects; the documents used in this connection; correspondence relating thereto. 2. Methods of securing payments for goods imported or exported; documents of character; combination signs, and arrangement of keyboard for special requirements, tabulating devices; (b) correspondence—official and commercial, correct forms of address, composition and typing of letters on given material; (c) methods of duplicating—press copying, carbon, galvano, stencil, lithograph and used manuscript; (d) arrangements of authors' manuscripts, i. display and centring of headlines and sub-titles, setting out of marginal notes, verse, including rules controlling indentation of rhyming lines, extracts, tabular tables footnotes, signs used in correcting, etc. 2. Typing from copy—carefully punctuated, abbreviated and used manuscript selected from commercial, literary, technical, legal, dramatic, or other matter; alternative tests may be given. 3. Typing an invoice or account sales from unarranged details in manuscript, or tabulated statement from printed or manuscript copy. 4. Time test—typing for ten minutes from copy, and for ten minutes from 40 words, or

minute is expected.

**ENGLISH.**

1. COMPOSITION—The writing of an essay at a precise or a passage or other matter supplied. Other questions will be set to test *understanding* and use of the language.

2. LITERATURE—Reading (the not detailed study) of two books prescribed from time to time; (b) general knowledge of other well-known works in prose and verse.

For the Examinations of 1921 the books prescribed are "Hamlet," McDonough's, "Literature on Ireland," and a Book of Irish Verse, selected by W. B. Yeats, and Mitchell's "Jail Journal."

3. GRAMMAR—The functions of words and the structure of sentences.

4. SPELLING—The spelling will entail loss of marks.

Special importance is attached to English composition.

**LATIN.**

1. Passage from Latin Authors for translation into Irish or English; 2. A passage or passages of Irish or English prose to be translated into Latin; 3. Roman History, from 91 B.C. to 70 A.D.; 4. Outlines of Roman literature and art within that period; a passage of Irish or English for translation into Latin.

**MATHEMATICS.**

**ARITHMETIC.**—1. Compound Interest; Profit and Loss; the use of Logarithms. Books of Tables (to four places) will be supplied at the examination. 2. Graphical solutions of problems and interpretation of given graphs may be required. 3. Present worth; Breakers' Discount; Stocks and Shares.

**ALGEBRA.**—1. Simple questions involving two or three unknown quantities and problems thereof; quadratic equations in a single unknown quantity and easy problems soluble by such quantities; elementary theory of indices and


logarithms; 2. Simultaneous equations in two variables involving solution of simple or quadratic equations; theory of quadratic equations; imaginary quantities; arithmetical and geometrical progressions; logarithms; partial fractions; 3. Arithmetical and geometrical progression; Remainder Theorem and easy applications; 4. Permutations and combinations; binomial theorem and applications (proof of the binomial expansion will not be required except for the case of positive integral exponent); elimination of simultaneous quadratic equations, and equations reducible to such and questions leading to the elementary summation of series harmonic mean

of two quantities; elementary theory of scales of notation; annuities certain; problems of maxima and minima whose solution depends on the theory of quadratic equations.

2. *Geometry.*—The amount of geometrical knowledge will be expected approximately equivalent to that contained in Euclid, Books I, II, III, IV, and VI, and the definitions of Books V Deductions. Students may be required to give algebraical proof of the properties of the portions of geometry on which the establishment of the propositions of Euclid, Book VI, depends. 2. Questions may be set involving an elementary knowledge of: Centre of Mass Position, Conaxel Circles, Inversion, Point of Tangency, and the properties of the elements—analytical applications of pure geometry. 3. The analytical geometry of the straight line and circle, treated with reference to rectangular axes.

3. *Trigonometry.*—1. Trigonometry, sine and tangent tables; solution of triangles; plane and spherical triangles; properties of inverse functions; properties of circumscribed, inscribed and escribed circles of a triangle. Use of Logarithmic and trigonometrical tables. 2. Books of tables (to four places) may be supplied. 3. *Plane Trigonometry.*—1. *De Moivre's Theorem* and its applications to the expansion of trigonometrical series. Questions may be set involving knowledge in the other pure mathematical subjects.
