ARTICLE IV. - TENURE

(A) The Primary School from which the pupils come must have adopted the Greek League Examination Programme as modified by Dali Kireos viz., as follows:

- (i) Irish to be used for Roll Call, orders, prayers, &c.
- (ii) Irish to be taught for vernacular use of each child for at least one hour per day.
- (iii) The child to be taught to read in Irish.

(B) The Secondary School which the pupils of the Parents or Guardians, choose for the holding of a Scholarship shall have adopted in the Greek League Programme as modified by Dali Kireos viz., as follows:

- (i) Irish to be taught to all pupils for vernacular use.
- (ii) Irish history to be taught to all pupils.
- (iii) Examination Papers to be set in both English and Irish, each pupil to answer in the language of his own choice.
- (iv) A note-keeper of the two languages to be kept in use.
- (v) In examinations in a foreign language the use of that foreign language to be permitted in retelling and answering questions.

III. - TENURE OF SCHOLARSHIPS

VIII.—AWARDS.
Scholarships shall be awarded strictly in order of merit, &c.

IX.—EXAMINATION.

Candidates for Scholarships shall be subject to a competitive examination, oral and written, held by Examiners appointed by the Committee.

X.—GENERAL POWERS.

The Committee reserve to themselves the right to cancel any candidate from competing for a Scholarship without assigning a reason. The Committee also reserve the right to revise or suspend or any part of it at any time, subject to the sanction of the Lincoln County Council.
