The Press Association states that the Conference will be resumed at 11 o'clock to-morrow morning.

King's Private Secretary Calls

While the Conference was in session at Stamfordham, the King's Private Secretary, among the callers at 10 Downing-street, Lordship left just as the Irish delegates were leaving.

UPPER SILESIA.

Recommendations Approved

Reuter's agency reports that Mr. Balfour telegraphed from Geneva to-day stating the Council of the League of Nations has approved Upper Silesian recommendations.

Geneva, There was decided in recommending the new frontier to advise that there should be no safeguards against disruption of existing conditions.

Viscount Ishib declared that the solution at could not fail to contribute to peace.

UNEMPLOYMENT QUESTION

Demonstration in London

Deputation to Downing Street

A deputation by London's unemployed afternoons attracted considerable public attention. The demonstrators having expressed the intention of endeavouring to send a deputation to Prime Minister. They assembled on the bank, and just before 4 o'clock the demonstrators, numbering several thousands, on Fleet-street cheering and singing.

A deputation from the National Administrative Council of Unemployed was admitted during afternoon to 10 Downing-street.

leaving while on his way to the dining room house with Mrs Knox. He returned from London Monday.

NEW ZEALAND AND SHIPPING.

Wellington, Thursday.

LIMERICK STEAMER IN STORM. Loss of life.

While on her voyage from Liverpool to Limerick, the SS "Maugret," which arrived last night, encountered a heavy sea. The steamer is one of the vessels of the Limerick Steamship Company. She was Monday morning while rounding Enderby near Tralee Bay, by a terrific sea, and the ship's crew were all washed overboard. Mr Patrick Reynolds, of Turbot Island, man who was washed overboard and drowned. He died 27. In the sea running at the time attempt at rescue was not possible. Some cargo was also washed overboard.
