A REMOTE CLUSTER OF STARS.

In a recent study of stars by Mr. Harlow

Shapley, of Mount Wilson Observatory in

California, it is pointed out that the great

star cluster in Hercules consists of tens of

thousands of stars—more stars than we can

see in all the sky with the naked eye—and

that it is more than 8,000 times further away

than the nearest star now known.

Light requires eight minutes to travel the

98,000,000 miles from the sun to the earth,

but it must travel more than 2,000,000,000

times as long to reach us from the Hercules

cluster. The cluster's distance is about

36,000 light years; that is, its light takes

about that number of years to reach us.

The mass of the whole cluster is probably

in excess of 100,000 suns, yet the cluster as a

whole seems to be moving at far over a hun-

drd miles a second.

Compared with the great star clusters, our

star system appears insignificant, and our

sun "only a yellow dwarfish, very old star,"

occasionally situated in a large moving star

cluster, which is itself situated still more

eccentrically in an immensely larger stellar

organization.

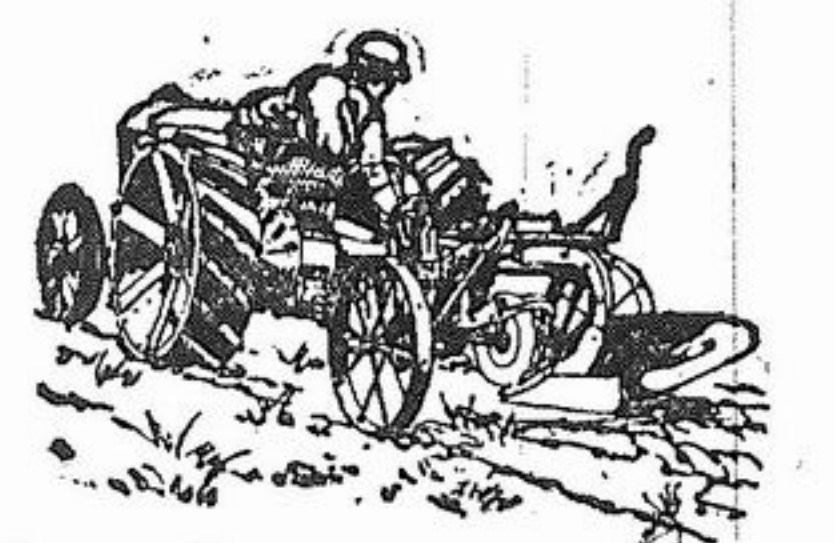

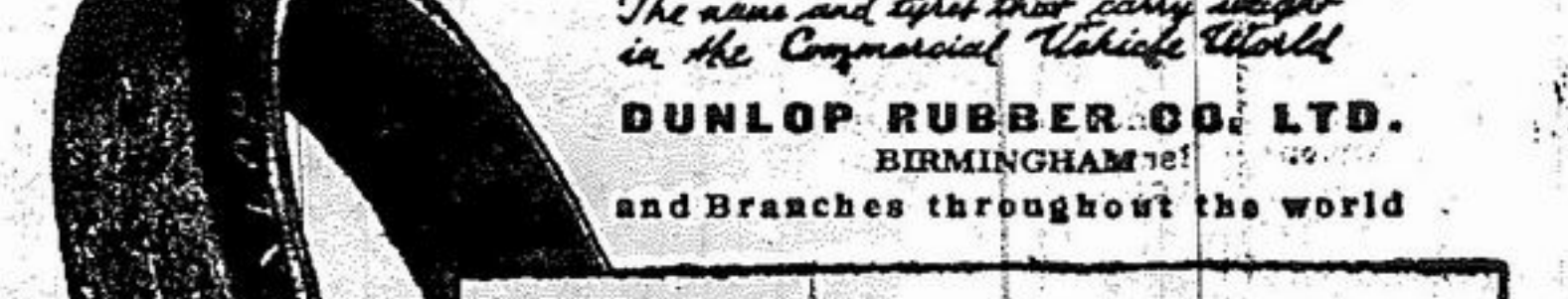

FUTURE G. ARTILLERY.

Lessons of the Great War.

The French General Staff are already re-modelling their artillery training and practice on the lessons of the Great War, and a most interesting—though not actually highly technical—paper on the subject was read by Belg.-General Baron de Kijck at the Royal Artillery Institution, Woolwich, on Colonel de M'Ferson's recent chair. General Evans summarised the development of artillery in the French Army, from the period immediately prior to the war, with some illuminating side-light on our own system. It was pointed out that the French realised how important an arm the artillery was, and they suffered much from a shortage of ammunition. The Germans had developed a heavy artillery, but by the aid of God and General Evans, they had not provided enough ammunition. He suggested that Von Hindler's success at Riga, followed by General Breck's break through the German lines by tank, determined the use of the artillery in the latter stages of the war. The French had now decided that the artillery should

General who would command them in war. No one could prophesy what the next war would be like, but a certain superiority in material would not be essential. He mentioned that the French had adapted light agriculture tractors for military purposes, and these could take a gun along a road or over a trackless area. £

An interesting fact was that the French were finding difficulty in obtaining artillery officers. He mentioned that the British had the honour and the status and privilege of the artillery, and that cadets who have gone through the Artillery School at Pontefract preferred to return to civil life, so that resort had to be had to aspirants of non-commissioned officers.

It is interesting to note the opinion seemed to be in favour of domestic and not of foreign arms in the British Army.
