A highly tender industry like the dairying in. dustry cannot be carried on under circumstances of this nature. Means must be devised to prevent contracts being wantenly broken, whereby a serious loss of food production is sustained by the nation in general, and one that cannot be borne by individual farmers in this year of depression. It is to be hoped that the National Government will institute a strict inquiry into the causes that have led up to these serious consequences, and thereby avert any future disorders. A very representative Strike Committee was appointed to inaugurate a fund, so that individual farmers would not suffer serious loss in resisting interference with their business, and which would evectually lead to the abandonment of dairying in the country. The dairying industry gives good employment, and the rural workers will be in a serlous plight if the industry is broken up. The strike weapon interferes materially with the progress of any industry, but it is absolutely fatal to dairying.

dressed in plain clothes, the sergeant wearing a trench coat and soit hat, while the constable had a brown overcoat and hat. They put up at! Flansgan's hotel, and on Wednesday went to the coursing at Mount Coote. That cight the man who accompanied the sergesuit and constable left Kilma-lock by the night mail for Thurles, earlying with needsy's events. The sergeant and constable had in the meantime retired to Cleary's Hotel, where the draw in connection with Thursday's programme was taking place. 
