GREYHOUNDS LIMERICK GREYHOUND STADIUM

Work on new multi-million greyhound stadium begins

WORK on the new €18 million Limerick Greyhound Stadium has begun at the site of the former Greenpark Racecourse.

Greyhound enthusiasts in the mid-west will be relieved to hear that the filling and preparation of the site for the new Greyhound Stadium has started.

The filling operation got under way in recent days when the first lorries arrived and unloaded their cargo. The filling process will last for a number of months and thousands of lorries will visit the site during the operation. The new 500m track and state-of-the-art stadium will be the centre-piece of the development. The stand in the new stadium will feature viewing and dining areas and several bars. The next stage is being finalised at present with the completion of the interviews for the selection of the Project Manager for the works.

Notices for tenders have also been issued for the main contractors and specialists for the development. These should be in place over the next couple of months.

Tony McKenna, Chairman of Limerick Greyhound Stadium & IGB Board Director welcomed the devel-

opments He said: "The commencement of this work demonstrates the commitment of the Irish Greyhound Board in bringing a state of the art facility to the greyhound owners and breeders of Limerick.

"It is long overdue and will be a benchmark for future developments in greyhound racing circles not only in Ireland but abroad.

'This is yet another example of the strong sporting tradition that Limerick has and the location will be ideal for visitors not only to the mid-west region, but from all over Ireland.'

TIPPERARY Racecourse stages its Super Sunday raceday this weekend when the track hosts a bumper card featuring top flat and National Hunt racing.

The €70,000 Ballykisteen Hotel and Golf Resort Tipperary Hurdle is set to be another completive renewal of the early season jumps calen-

The line-up for Sunday's race is likely to include Larkwing, an impressive winner of the Kevin McManus Grimes Hurdle at the track in July, Lounanas from the Eoin Griffin yard and Jessica Harrington's Tipperary All-Star.

The €80,000 Group Coolmore Stud Concorde Stakes will once again be a competitive contest which could see Psalm bid to add to her two previous victories at the rack in 2008. Charlie Swan's, Limerick-owned Crooked Throw, will be trying to win his initial Group race, while Jessica Harrington's Jumbajukiba will be seeking to add to his Group 3

The competitive card will also feature The O'Dwyer Steel Like a Butterfly Novice Chase and The Tipperary Supporter's Club Joe Mac Novice Hurdle. The opening race on the card is the Longfield Stables Abergwaun

Multiple Cheltenham Champion Hurdle winner Istabraq will once again be paraded during the day along with banks' king, Risk of Thunder.

Patrons can enter a special racecard draw for a

four-day trip to the 2009 Cheltenham festival, by sponsored Tully Travel, Carlow, while there will also be a draw for a luxury Tipperary Co-Op hamper.
