

The Story of Ireland

PENAL LAWS

(MICHAEL DORE, DUBLIN)

These Laws were enacted, which took away the civil and religious rights from catholics. They were not allowed to vote or hold public office, nor were they eligible for election to parliament. Catholic schools were banned, and children were educated in so called 'hedge schools'; they were in the open air in fields and teachers travelled from place to place teaching as they went.

In the time of the Penal Laws registers were not kept for obvious reasons; the problem of catholic genealogy in Ireland is a problem of record.

Our search has gathered some interesting facts about the farms of our ancestors. Edmond's (John's father's) farm at Gortnagloss is intact to this day, about 98 statute acres, but is now on the point of being taken over by the land commission for sub-division.

> O'DOWER = DORE (MICHAEL DORE, DUBLIN)



The original name was O'Dower and was changed about 1830 (that evidence from the marriage certificate of Ellena Dore, John's sister), when names were anglicised. 'O' was not used in those days in any official entries. There were Elizabethan and Cromwellian statutes prohibiting the use of both 'O' and 'Mac', obviously aimed at breaking up the clan system. These laws were not enforced too strictly against the use of 'Mac'; however the last time 'O' was generally used in an official way was in the long lists of catholics who had their lands confiscated because they had actively supported the Jacobite cause at the end of the 17th century.

The clergy, when they began to keep records, maintained the custom of dropping the 'O' and it did not come back into general use until the gaelic revival at the end of the 19th century.

Great credit is due to John and Elizabeth Dore for having the initiative and foresight to launch forth upon a new life in Australia in 1841.

These were still pre-famine times before emigration was the popular thing it was later to become. By emigrating with their family when they did. they avoided the hard years of the famine which started in 1845, and their children avoided the equally hard years of the 1880s when agricultural prices collapsed and the land war ensued.

It certainly must have taken great courage to brave the long voyage to Australia in the ships of those days and face the unknown life that lay beyond.

O'Dower-Dore

(MARY COCHRANE)

A short history and family tree of three brothers, Edmond, Maurice and John. Edmond's son Robert started the Queensland branch. Two of Maurice's daughters came to Victoria.

It is just 140 years since John came to Gippsland with his wife and four children.

John Dore 1808 — 1895, Elizabeth O'Connor 1808 — 1876 Gortnagloss Clounleharde

County Limerick, Eire

Melbourne 1841 — 'Mt Ararat', Westernport, 1842

John Dore, youngest son of Edmond Dore and Helena Murphy was born at Gortnagloss about 1808.

He married Elizabeth O'Connor of Clounleharde, probably at Ardagh,

which is the parish north of Newcastle West.

John lived at Clounleharde as a 'claoin isteach', that is an Irish expression which denotes a situation where a man marries into a farm. Four children were born there: Edward 1833 (my grandfather), Thomas 1835, Patrick 1838, and Ellen 1840.

John and Elizabeth, with their family, sailed from Plymouth aboard the 'Forth' as assisted migrants on 25 May, 1841, arriving in Melbourne 19 September, 1841; another daughter, Mary, was born on the Forth, but

They lived on the Merri Creek for a short time; our research hasn't revealed exactly where, but then in 1842 they settled on the Ararat Creek on land that later was selected by James Seymour.

In 1844, John Dore in partnership with Michael Hennessy, took up 'Mt Ararat Creek' B lease, an area of 5120 acres. There is a copy of grant of land purchase to them on 17 December, 1855, 640 acres for £640 as tenants in common.

Gortnagloss

If Begley's account is correct (see History of the Diocese of Limerick Vol. III, page 29), one might reasonably assume that the Dores of The walking Gortnagloss were originally tenants of the Lacys of Rathcahill. According to him, Patrick Lacy, who died in 1741, was buried in Monagea Churchvard at the spot in the ruined church where the altar once stood, and his tenants were subsequently buried in the same ruin just behind him extending to the western gable. For generations the Dores have been buried at the centre of this area. In the same regard, it is significant that Ruttlidge Browne, who inherited the Lacy lands through his mother, Lucy Lacy, was a joint witness with Robert Dower of the marriage of the latters daughter, Helen, to Maurice Woulfe of Templeathea on 23 February, 1784.

This Robert, whose wife's identity is not known, occupied the farm nearest to the main road, which consisted of 58 plantation acres and is

intact to the present day. His son, Maurice, occupied portion of a farm of 124 plantation acres further up from him, obviously as a claoin isteach: Maurice was married to his cousin, Mary Dower. He and two other related Dower families shared the same yard, each being in occupation of a different portion of the same farm which remained in the Devon Rentals under the sole name of James Dower: In the Rental of 1882 — the last one extant — James's executors are entered as tenants. Robert's brother, Maurice, occupied a farm at Ballylinane.

According to tradition, Robert's father was also named Robert. The prominence of this name in the Gortnagloss families of every generation is a feature which distinguishes them from the Meenoline

Group.

As far as can be gleaned from parish registers and other sources. Robert Dower had issue.

- A son, probably Robert, who settled in Ardagh. His daughter Margaret m. James Enright of Skehanagh; his son Robert entered the Augustine order where he had a distinguished career being six times Prior of their Limerick house and Provincial in 1839.

Edmond, second son of Robert Dower of Gortnagloss, originally of Arranagh, later of Rathcahill and finally of Gortnagloss, m. Ellen Murphy. Their known issue were.

- 1a. Robert, bat. 30 September, 1788. He had a public house at Bridge Lane, Newcastle West (Bridge Street did not then exist). It is not known whether he m. but obviously d. without leaving issue as he left the pub to his cousin Patrick.
- b. Edmond, from whom the Queensland branch descended.
- c. John b. 1808, m. Elizabeth O'Connor of Clounleharde, where he lived for a time as a claoin isteach. In 1841 he emigrated with his family to Australia and obtained land at Nar Nar Goon in the vicinity of Melbourne which he farmed successfully. D.13 March, 1895. According to a report in the Pakenham Gazette on 26 April, 1978, on a Sunday shortly before that date, 450 of the descendants of John and Elizabeth assembled at Pakenham Racecourse, Victoria, for a reunion. The event was preceded by mass at Nar Nar Goon, celebrated by a great grandson, Fr. John Van Suylen, and a welcome to those attending was extended by a great grandson, Greg Dore of Benalla. Some had travelled from Queensland and New South Wales, and apologies for nonattendance were received from as far away as Western Australia.
- d. Maurice m. Bridget Hough (Howe) and had issue. His daughters Margaret and Mary emigrated to Australia in 1853. From whom the Dunbar and O'Rourke family descend. Mary, bapt. 16 April, 1791, m. Conor O'Connell of Clash, Athea, and had issue.
- f. Ellen m. 4 February, 1834, as his second wife, Jeremiah ("Darby") Curtin of Killacullen, Tour., and had issue.

The first house at 'Mt Ararat' was built to the left of the driveway about half way up the hill. The second house of solid brick, built about 1846 by a ship's carpenter, has walls thirteen inches thick. A large cellar was used to store apples and other farm produce.

Dad (Frank Dore) said that they would call in at the 'Mount' on their way home from school at North Nar Nar Goon, for 'goodies'. Very large Shorthorn cows were the dairy herd. Before separators came into use, the milk would be set in huge dishes in the cellar.

A journey by bullock waggon was made about every three months to Melbourne with farm produce, potted butter was one item, and the return trip would bring flour and sugar by the bag and chests of tea.

There were no schools in those early days; Edward, Thomas and Patrick Dore attended the Mt. Pleasant School at the Toomuc Creek in 1854; their ages were 21, 19 and 16 years. The first schools were catholic schools, the parents finding teachers and paying their wages.

A school was established at 'Mt Ararat', the salary for the teacher was transferred from Fiery Creek in the Beaufort area, to Mt Ararat on 6 September, 1856. A grant of £100 in aid of erection of the school was made. The first section of the building was erected during the months of March-April, 1857, and the second portion in the course of September-October, 1857.

Michael, John, Elizabeth and Mary Dore attended the school in 1861. The school came under the Denominational School Board in 1862. There was no catholic church in the area until St. Agatha's, Cranbourne, was built in 1862 and St. Patrick's, Pakenham, in 1871.

The priest rode on horseback, first from St. Francis' Church, Melbourne, and later from Brighton, to celebrate Mass at Mt Ararat homestead. St. James' Church, Nar Nar Goon, was built in 1905.

This area was known as Westernport as late as August 1861 when Edward Dore was married. Aborigines referred to the mount as 'Mt Mungeribah', meaning 'a place of red earth'.

John Dore died 13 March, 1895

A Requiem Mass and office were celebrated in St. Patrick's Church, Pakenham, 15 March, 1895 for the repose of the soul of Mr J. Dore of Mount Ararat. The celebrant was the Very Rev. M. Casey of Elsternwick, assisted by the Rev. W. Quilter as deacon, and the Rev. J. Daly as sub-deacon.

Notwithstanding the heavy downpour of rain, a large number of the clergy, and nearly all the people of the district attended. The deceased gentleman was the genuine type of true-born Irishman and clung with all the tenacity of the race to the undying faith of his fathers, and handed it down at last after his long and prosperous life as the best inheritance he could bequeath to his children. He was one of those generous-hearted Irish Catholics to be met with, indeed, very generally throughout the bush of Australia, under whose hospitable roof the Soggarth Aroon found at all seasons a real Cead Mille Failthe, and we were very glad to see so many of the cloth standing around his grave.

During the lifty-two years he spent in the district, of which he was one of the earliest pioneers, he won the respect of all classes by the simple force of an upright and blameless character. As a disciple of Fr. Matthew, his long life of eighty-seven years furnishes the friends of temperance with another illustration of the alliance so often claimed to exist between

teetotalism and longevity.

He leaves behind him a large family well provided for — heirs alike to his virtues and his property. May he rest in peace.





The 'Ned' Dores

(MARY COCHRANE)

Edward Dore, born Clounlehard 1833, died 14 February, 1911, Pakenham. Eldest of the family of John and Elizabeth, aged eight years when they came to Melbourne, he could not read or write, as there was no school to attend until he was an adult, but learn he did when the opportunity came.

Ned bought 202 acres on the corner of Dore Road and the Gippsland

Road, now Princes Highway, on 5 April, 1861, for £233-6-3.

On 29 August, 1861, when 28 years of age, he married Mary Josephine Shiels, 19 years, of Prahran, at St. Mary's Church, Dandenong Road, East St. Killda, whose father, Thomas Shiels, was the first man to build a house in Prahran, where he owned a big stretch of open country including what is now Chapel Street.

They came to live on the farm at Dore Road which they called 'The

Range'.

The first house was wattle and daub, of four rooms, and it was very cool in summer. The present house was built some years later, but the original was in use as well until the late 1930's.

Edward was elected to the Berwick Shire Council in January 1873 and

remained a member for some 14 years.

In June 1877 he bought 173 acres on the corner of Mt Ararat Road and Gippsland Road; his youngest son Frank, inherited that block after

Ned's death in February 1911.

He also bought 144 acres adjoining the railway, next to the 'White Swamp', owned by J. G. Dore. This block went to James who married Johanna (Cis) Ryan; Jim sold this and bought a home at Cardigan Street, East-St. Kilda. Their son Tom Dore, now of Briar Hill, a Melbourne suburb, inherited his mother's farm, 'Holy Cross' (named after a town in Tipperary, Eire) on the corner of Ryan Road and Princes Highway, now the subdivision of 'Bimbadeen Downs'.

Three sons of Edward and Mary, John E., Tom and Ned went to Western Australia to seek their fortune in the gold rush of 1894 at Kalgoorlie. Ned died of typhoid fever in their early days on the gold fields.

Jack purchased the lease of the Mulline Hotel, north of Kalgoorlie in

1903, £800 ingoing, weekly rent £6-10-0.

Tom Dore, along with Jack Frawley (Pakenham) were quartz carting to the Government Battery, which paid very well. They had 18 horses and drays, the best in the colony. The horses cost from £50 to £70 each, the drays, which were built specially for the work, cost up to £35 each; all the horses worked in single drays and were driven by three men, and made on an average about £1 per day with each team. Tom bought Mulline Station.

In 1910 he married Caroline McLean of Gippsland at Menzies,

Western Australia.

John E. married Mary O'Neill of Bendigo in Perth. John did not return to Gippsland to visit until 1937, 43 years after going to the West.

After some years Jack and Tom went to Perth. Twenty-three of Jack's descendants live around Perth and near country areas, the youngest, a great-great-grandson, Luke McCarthy, the only fifth generation Australian born of this branch.

Seventeen of Tom's descendants are living in Perth's suburbs

Ned's eldest daughter, Elizabeth, married Bernard McAloon, wood merchant of Prahran; their daughter Elizabeth Savage lived in the old home 'The Range' for 46 years, until her death on July 10, 1981. Her husband Richard still resides there.

Francis Peter, b. 29-6-1883, d. 6-9-1970

Frank married Annie Rose Kennedy on 10 November, 1915, and continued on his farm until ill health forced him to retire to Pakenham town in 1946. He then leased the farm and when the lease expired in June 1952, his daughter Mary Cochrane and son-in-law Dominic (Nic) Cochrane took over 'Carinya' and dairy farmed until they sold the property in April 1976.

Frank passed away on 6 September, 1970, aged 87 years. He was a great sportsman and played football with Pakenham for 14 years starting when he was 17. He was closely associated with Pakenham Picnic Racing Club from its early days. The sport at which he excelled most was cricket; he was a first-class bowler and more than useful batsman.

He played cricket with the 'Mt Ararat' team on their ground on Ryan's

Road, and later with Pakenham.

He also played golf when Pakenham had its club on Bourke's property adjoining the Racecourse, and his wife Ann was secretary of the Ladies' Golf Club for a number of years.

The FitzGibbons

(MARY KARPASITIS)

The FitzGibbon family lived in Gippsland, a dairy farm at Tyers, via Traralgon. There were ten children in the family, all educated at home by their father.

Joe was a policeman.

Mary helped her cousins, Joe and Jack Hunt, at the Criterion Hotel, Rochester, Victoria, before she joined the Good Shepherd Sisters at Albert Park. (Sr. Alphonse) was a well known figure in Melbourne Courts, with her work in caring for delinquent girls at the Convent at Albert Park. She died at the grand age of 98 years.

Ted and Mick were station masters. Ellen (Sr. Colletta), Good Shep-

herd Convent, Abbotsford, later went to Tasmania.

Margaret was a nurse at Sunbury Hospital. Patrick went to New Zealand, became a farmer; when his wife died suddenly, he returned to Tyers to live with Kate and Tom on the farm. When Margaret retired from nursing she also went home to Tyers.

Elizabeth married Thomas Ryan.

John and Catherine Buckley

(ANNE VAN SUYLEN)

In 1861 John Buckley settled in the Parish of Balnarring, being the first resident in it, and now owns 610 acres of land on which he conducts grazing, farming and breeding.

John was a member of the Shire Council for nine years, which

position he resigned four years ago, 1884.

John married Catherine Dore of 'Mt Ararat'. The story of John's proposal to Kate is rather amusing. On a visit to 'Mt Ararat' one evening, the family were saying the Rosary, when they came to say 'Holy Mary, Mother of God'; John says, 'Will you have me Kate?'. The merriment that followed caused some delay in the Rosary that night. John Buckley gave the land for the first catholic church at Balnarring.

Elizabeth Dore - Patrick J. Daly

Elizabeth, youngest daughter of John and Elizabeth Dore, 'Mt Ararat', married 'P.J.' Daly. Their property at Dalyston was known as 'Cloverdale', comprising about 600 acres. At 'Cloverdale' it was open house to all, Liz was known to all as 'Mam' and they made visitors most welcome. They

returned to Oakleigh in later life and died there.

Three Daly Bros. went to the Wonthaggi area from Springvale around 1885 to 1890. John, 'P.J.' and James. They were road contractors in Springvale. Sandown Racecourse is built on the Daly land. 'P.J.' was one of the men responsible for the railway going through to the Wonthaggi area. James Daly married Jessie Dunbar, whose mother Margaret Dore, of County Limerick, was a niece of John Dore.

Mary Elizabeth Dore, Hunt - McCarthy

(CLAIRE JAMESON)

Hugh Aloysius Hunt of Tipperary, Ireland, came to Australia in 1861 with his wife Anna, of County Limerick. Anna died October 1870 leaving a

young family with ages ranging from seven to two years.

A year or so later Hugh went 'a-courting' to 'Mt Ararat'. Mary Elizabeth Dore became his second wife about 1872. Their first son, Joe, was born at 'Mt Ararat' in February 1873; his brother Tom was born at Plough and Harrows Hotel in March 1875, followed by Elizabeth Agnes in April 1877, John De Vere (my father) June 1879, Hugh Aloysius (Jnr.) in 1881.

My grand father died 28 March, 1882 at Moorabbin and is buried at Carlton with his first wife and other members of his family who pre-

deceased him.

Again a young family, ages nine to three years was left, as well as three members from the first family for their mother to care for alone, so they stayed at 'Mt Ararat' where my father and his brothers and sister spent their first school days, later going to the Brothers at Victoria Parade

and Star of the Sea Convent respectively.

In the intervening years my grandmother was connected with the Criterion Hotel at Rochester, later marrying Patrick McCarthy, after which they lived at the Hotel at Murchison (Royal), later known as Coutt's Hotel. From this union, a son Willie was born. As a small boy he later drowned in the flooded Goulburn River while clinging to the back of his father who was trying to swim the river for a bet; the father also drowned. The family later made their home at Pakenham.

My memory of my grandmother McCarthy is of an old lady dressed in black sitting in a rocking chair (most times with a book or her Rosary in her hands) at the residence, next to St. Patrick's School at Pakenham, where I went for a holiday each year. My Aunt Liz (Elizabeth Hunt), a kind and very

sincere lady, was a teacher at the school for thirty-odd years and on those visits to Pakenham, my sister Sheila and brother Jack and I took our place in the school room for lessons alongside her pupils, many of whom are still residing in Pakenham and would have the same memories of her. A chapel at the now convent perpetuates that memory.

My grandmother remained in residence at Pakenham until the time of

her death, 18 August, 1931.

Items of Interest HUGH HUNT, 17 JULY, 1860, IRELAND

(CLAIRE JAMESON)

£2 Fr. Lanigan, £1-5-6 for carriage, £1-2-9 passage to Cork, £2-12-6 at Mrs Fitzgerald's, then from Cork to Waterford £1-11-0, where presumably the honeymoon was spent for two weeks. As another notation, 'rent for fortnight' £1-14-0. Certainly a far cry from the high costs of today.

The Hunts

(MAY HUNT, SISTER TARCISIUS)

Joseph Aloysius was born on February 21, 1873 and married Ellen (Lena) Nowlan, whose parents Peter and Ellen (Kennedy) of County Tipperary, Ireland, had settled in Shoreham on the Mornington Peninsula in 1846.

Lena was born on 2 July, 1873, received her early education at the Shoreham State School (winning one of the rare Government Scholarships awarded in those days) and continued her studies at Vaucluse Loreto Convent in Richmond. It was at this time that Lena met Joe Hunt, who was pursuing an apprenticeship in coach-building while studying at night at the Melbourne Technical College (then known as the Workingmen's College).

On 15 January, 1900, Joseph married Lena Nowlan at St. McCarten's

Church, Mornington.

For a time they lived at the Criterion Hotel, Rochester, Victoria; from there they went to live at Leongatha, South Gippsland, but finally settled in Malvern in about 1903.

Taking up his trade of coach-building, Joseph, with his brother Thomas, who was a wheelwright by trade, opened their own business in Dandenong Road, Malvern, trading under the name Hunt Brothers.

There were ten children of this marriage. The four daughters all

became members of the Brigidine Sisters.

Thomas Hunt married Laura Adams of Castlemaine and lived in Malvern. They had no children.

John Bernard Dore

Born 1 February, 1850 at 'Mt Ararat', the seventh child of John and Elizabeth Dore

Baptised - 22 October, 1850

Sponsors - Patrick Hale, Mary Hayes.

Priest — Father Bourgeois.

(This information found in the Cranbourne file at 24 Brunswick Street, Fitzrov).

(St. Agatha's Church, Cranbourne not open till 1861). Educated at R.C. School at 'Mt Ararat'

He married Hanora Dore (born in County Limerick, Ireland, daughter of Michael Dore, farmer, and Bridget Hartnett) at St. John's Church, Heidelberg on 31 December, 1877.

Priest - Father Horan

Witnesses - William Dunbar, Elizabeth Dore

John Bernard lived all his married life farming at Mt Ararat Road, Nar Nar Goon. He and Hanora had three Children, Elizabeth, Michael Thomas and John Gregory.

Hanora died 9 January, 1887, aged 39 years, and was buried in the Pakenham Cemetery.

John Bernard then married Mary Teresa Foster, 10 October, 1888. Children -

Joseph - Urana, N.S.W. Farmer.

Thomas - Melbourne Fire Brigade and S.E.C., Sydney,

Edward — Urana, Farmer.

Nellie — Convent of Mercy, Mount Gambier, S.A.

Maurice - Farming mostly in N.S.W.

David - Killed 1st A.I.F.

Mary Teresa died 6 January, 1901, aged 43 years, and was buried in

Pakenham Cemetery.

John Bernard married for the third time, April 1904, to a Mrs West, and about ten months later, he and his wife were driving in the linker, when they were struck by a train at a level crossing in the township of Nar Nar Goon and John died on the way to hospital, 18 February, 1905, aged 55 years.

John Gregory Dore

(NONIE SULLIVAN)

Born 3 March, 1881, at 'The Oaks', Mt Ararat Road, Nar Nar Goon, the younger son of Hanora and John Bernard. He commenced his 'formal' education at a school on Carney's property, then later at Nar Nar Goon State School No. 2248, situated at the junction of the Bald Hill Road and Seven Mile Road

At the age of eleven he left school to help his father on the farm. His mother died on the 9th January, 1887, leaving three children, Bessie eight vears, Michael seven, and John six. When their father was killed in a level crossing accident at Nar Nar Goon, 18 February, 1905, the farm had to be sold and John bought 308 acres, 1 rood and 14 perches for £1279-12-0, known as the 'White Swamp' on the corner of Bald Hill Road and Mt Ararat

In 1913 he was elected to the Berwick Shire Council as a councillor for the Pakenham Riding, where he served for 43 years.

When his Aunt Kate and Uncle Pat Dore died within a few weeks of each other in 1916, the remaining half of the original Mt Ararat Creek Preemptive Right was sold to John Gregory for £5,423-0-0. There he raised sheep, a few cattle, horses and pigs. Crops grown were potatoes, oats, millet and rape.

On the 6th November, 1918, John married Jane Smith, the youngest daughter of Marmaduke and Catherine Smith (nee Mulcare). Both of Jane's grandparents Smiths and Mulcares were amongst the earliest settlers in this district.

John and Jane had five sons and one daughter. The first - premature twin boys - died when only a few days old, and another son, James, when he was nearly three years. The surviving members are Nonie, Greg and

Michael Thomas Dore died a bachelor at the age of 48 in 1928. It was then that John, his brother, sold 100 acres including the beautiful old home that his grandparents built about 1844, and moved to 'The Homestead', Mt Ararat Road. There he continued farming, including dairying until 1953, when he, his wife, his sister Bessie and daughter Nonie, moved into a new home on Mt Ararat. The Homestead property of some 640 acres he divided between his sons Greg and Tom.

In 1956 he retired from the Shire of Berwick Council. He received the M.B.E. in the Queen's Birthday honours — June 1957, for his 43 years'

distinguished honorary service as a Councillor.

The people of the Shire and in particular the residents of Nar Nar Goon gave a complimentary social in the Soldiers Memorial Hall, Nar Nar Goon on 3 October, 1956, in recognition of John's outstanding service to the community. He continued to live out his life, until 18 June, 1970, in beautiful surroundings on the south-eastern slope of the property he loved so dearly - 'Mt Ararat'.

His sister Bessie pre-deceased him on 18 June, 1964, and his wife Jane, died 23 May, 1971. Nonie remained in the home on the property, and

continued nursing at the Pakenham Bush Nursing Hospital.

Greg, his wife Mary (nee Dunbar) and their five children moved to

'Marangan', a farming property in Benalla, March 1972.

Tom, his wife Joan and the two youngest of his six children sold the property in Mt Ararat Road, and moved to an 808 acre farm in Dunkeld in 1974.

New South Wales

(DES AND GERALD DORE)

Joseph Thomas Dore, born 27 November, 1890, at 'The Oaks', Mt Ararat Road, Nar Nar Goon, second eldest of five boys and one girl, second family of John Bernard Dore.

He went to live at 'Cloverdale', Dalyston, the home of his Uncle Pat J. Daly and Aunt Liz Daly (nee Elizabeth Dore, Mt Ararat) in 1905 after his father was killed at the level crossing near Nar Nar Goon.

Here he drove a bullock team and carted timber to the Wonthaggi coal

miners

He returned to Mt Ararat in 1916 after the death of his Uncle and Aunt, Pat and Kate Dore, staved with his brother John G. until later that year when he went to New South Wales, and joined his brother Ned who had been there two years earlier.

They grew wheat on shares at 'Brookong', Lockhart district, for two years and in 1920 bought his first farm at Cullivel, named 'Doreen', from

Peter Greia.

On 17 March, 1921, he married Margaret McMahon of Yarrawonga. They had five sons and one daughter. About four years later they moved out to a property on the edge of Lake Urana. In 1927 they moved again, this time to 'Springfield', a farm on the main road to Narrandera, about seven miles out of Urana.

During that time Joe cleared the Murray Pine which was rather thick, bred and broke all his draught horses, grew wheat and grazed sheep, until his youngest son Brian married and took over the farm in the early 1960s.

He then bought a home in Urana and resided there until his death on

30 June, 1972.

(TED AND BRENDA DORE)

Edward Bernard Dore was born at Nar Nar Goon, Victoria, on 17 April, 1892, the sixth child of John Bernard, the third by Mary Foster, his second wife.

At the age of 12 years, Edward had lost both parents and he was reared by his Aunt Bridget Dore and Michael and Bess, his brother and sister.

In 1914 at the age of 21, Ned came from Gippsland to work as a farm labourer at Milbrulong for 'old Michan' who was 'a great old fellow'.

He worked for £1 a week and times were very difficult as a drought was extensive that year.

Mr Michan died and Ned was sent to work for a Mr Richter.

Later that year he went to work at the Boree Creek Station for Mr Jim

Scott during the harvest, again for £1 a week.

At that time Ned knew nothing about wheat farming. The Christmas before he died, he told his grandson that he did not know which way the wheat went in or out of the harvester. They finished up with one to three bags per acre and returned home to Gippsland.

Perhaps this was the occasion when Ned had to sell his horses to obtain enough money for the fare in order to attend the wedding of his

brother John G.

In 1915 Ned returned to Lockhart and bought a team of eight horses for £22 each. In 1916 he grew a crop 'by the old dog trap' at the property now known as 'Brookong'.

Tổ quote Ned, 'the hail took four bags, but we still stripped ten bags'. Two years later he bought his first property where 'Woodlands' now is, and built his first house out of mud, a pisế house.

In 1922 he married Irene Mildred Cornell, whom he met after playing his first football match in a paddock which is now part of 'Bellevue'.

He sold his land and share farmed at 'Bellevue' for two years.

Then he bought a property at Urangeline, which he called 'Cornella'. Ned and Rene had six children: Jeffrey, John (killed in action 1939-

1945 war), Betty, Gregory, Robert and Edward.

Ted bought 'Bellevue' a short time before his first wife Mary died, leaving him with six children; he remarried a year or so later, sold the farm, and now lives at Port Macquarie, New South Wales. Ned is still spoken of with much love by Urana people. He was 'all things to all men'. He could be at ease with people from all walks of life and they with him. Completely unmaterialistic, he was a devout Christian and an avid spectator of all sports.

The twinkle was always in his deep blue eyes and he loved the land

and thrived on hard work.

No riches did he crave nor seek, his home no mansion grand. But just a simple, humble soul, and loved on every hand.

We'll miss him too at footy time, but it goes without restraints, When the whistle blows up yonder, he'll be rucking for the Saints.

They say there's none you can't replace, It's often wisely said,

But you can bet it's hard to find, another Uncle Ned.



'DEATH OF AN HONOURED IRISH AMERICAN'

Maurice Dore, real estate agent, died last week at his house, 1015 James Street, San Francisco. He was the soul of honour, and few men of the days of Forty-Nine have been so conspicuous as he is in this one respect. The most striking illustration of his honour is a part of the history of the State.

After the failure of the Bank of California on 25th August, 1875, and the suicide of Wm. C. Ralston, little or no notice could be found of the large private fortune of the man who had done so much for this State, and whose memory is beloved to this day. Then Maurice Dore came forward voluntarily, and said: "I have in my name about 400,000 dols worth of property belonging to Mr Ralston. Though there were no papers signed

between us, the property was his."

It was Ralston's habit to trust his friends just as he had trusted Maurice Dore, and it is certain that to many the President of the Bank of California thus turned over large portions of his private fortune. Of these confidants of the millionaire but one was worthy of the trust, but one came forward and that was Maurice Dore. No one but he knew that Ralston had placed the property in his name. No one would ever or could ever have been any the wiser if Maurice Dore had not himself come forward and said that the property belonged to Ralston. Mr Dore was not a poor man, even in those days, though he was not a millionaire by any means. The quiet, unostentatious manner in which Dore resigned the 400,000 dollars worth of property staggered people, and to this day his name is not mentioned without the story being recalled.

He earned his reputation as an honest man, and few men have ever paid so high a price for the satisfaction of knowing that he was honest for no one would ever had known that he was not if he had held the

400,000 dollars worth of property.

Maurice Dore was born near Limerick, in Ireland, in 1820, and came to California by way of Australia in 1849. He landed in San Francisco, and soon after he entered the liquor business, which he followed for about 20 years. Since 1869 he has been a real estate dealer and auctioneer. It was in this latter occupation that Mr Dore met and won the esteem of Ralston. Always a temperate man, of modest tastes, he acquired a comfortable fortune, and though at one time he was beset by financial troubles, he weathered them successfully, and at his death was in good circumstances.



Irish migrants on board the 'Bates Family' sailed from Liverpool 7 March, 1863, arrived Melbourne 8 June, 1863, 628 passengers.

Mary, Margaret and a brother went to stay at Mt Ararat with their Aunt and Uncle, John and Elizabeth Dore (nee O'Connor). My research has failed to discover details of the others, except maybe Michael. A Michael O'Connor was station master at Nar Nar Goon in the 1880's. His photo is in the Dore family album.

Mary married a - Clifford, her grand son, Hubert Clifford, Doctor of Music, another relative, Edna Clifford, a music teacher. Briagalong was their home town.

Not sure of the relationship of Edward O'Connor to Elizabeth Dore. age suggests he was a nephew and the fact that the families kept in touch over a number of years.

Michael O'Connor, who married Nora Dalton, Clounleharde. Michael died after a few years of marriage; his widow, Nora, and her grandson prother have the farm that John and Elizabeth had before they came to Melbourne.

Nora's son, Fr. Michael O'Connor (O.M.I.), a Oblate Father in Dublin. Mary Elizabeth Hunt, step-daughter of Mary Dore (Mrs Hunt, then Mrs McCarthy), married David Bourke, Monomeith, Victoria. I am still doing research on that branch. Jane O'Connor, buried in a Hunt grave, is the only clue to date. And Pat O'Connor married a Hunt, Aunt of Mrs David Bourke.

Dore - Ahern

Daniel J. Ahern, one of the first school teachers in the Pakenham area was trained in Dublin and taught for three years in Newcastle West, County Limerick.

There was always a close friendship between Aherns and Dores. The

James Dore, of Newcastle West and Gortnagloss, b. 12 February, 1843 ('John' is the name entered on the parish birth register, but he was always known as James and is so identified in legal documents), married Bridget Ahern ('Penny') of Charleville, step-daughter of John Collins, merchant of that town, and niece of Bishop Ahern. 'Penny' died at Newcastle West, 17 January, 1893 and James subsequently emigrated with his family to U.S.A. His line is now extinct.

Sorry, no details of family.
